Stuart Dickson Awarded Honor

CFCY's Stuart Dickson has been awarded a membership in the Canadian Association of Broadcasters Century Club in recognition of 25 years of honorable and distinguished service to the broadcasting industry in Canada.

Mr. and Mrs. Dickson travelled to the Queen Elizabeth Hotel in Montreal where Mr. Dickson along with 33 other broadcasters, were presented membership awards, last week.

When Mr. Dickson began at CFCY 25 years ago it was a little shop on Great George Street with a staff of four. Mr. Dickson at that time was the only news announcer.

He entered the broadcasting business quite by accident, almost in a fairytale type of way. He was fishing one day with the late Col. Keith Rogers who liked his English accent and decided he would sound good on radio and since that time it has been numerous newscasts for Mr. Dickson.

In the early days of his career he would probably do five or six newscasts a day and during wartime, every quarter hour. He didn't spend all his time telling the public what was happening out on the front as he was out there fighting too. During the First World War he was with the Royal Flying Corp, the London Regiment and served as a Captain with the local Signal Regiment.

Prior to the war he did some broadcasting on the visit made by King George and Queen Elizabeth.

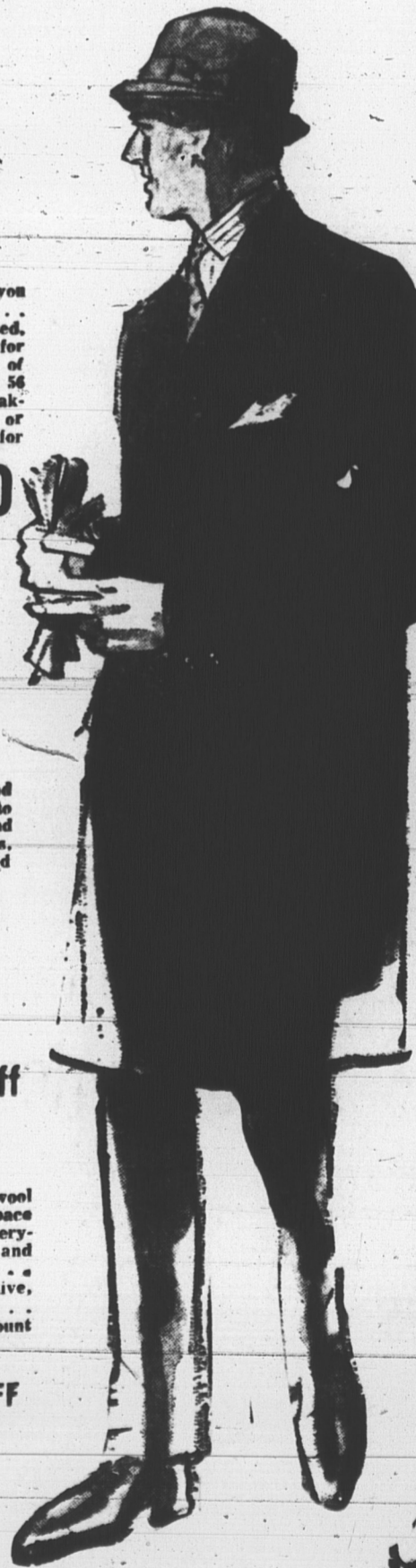
