

Four Schools in S' Side Damaged By Intruders

Four Summerside schools were broken into during the severe storm Friday morning, when vandals left behind a trail of broken glass and ransacked classrooms and offices. At least \$12,000 worth of property was lost.

At Elm Street, the glass was broken out of a door on the west side through which entry was made to the auditorium-gymnasium. Again the classrooms were broken into, after the glass in the doors was smashed. At Central Street, an intruder forced the rear door located on the east side of the building and rifled the rooms and offices.

A basement window leading to the workshop of the Summerside school was the means of entry into the building where more damage was done to doors and to a stock cabinet in the principal's office. The door of the cabinet was forced open but it is believed no money had been left there.

The damage is considerable due to the heavy breakage of glass. Some doors with large panels which were smashed out. Sgt. Harry Mackay is conducting an investigation into the breaks.

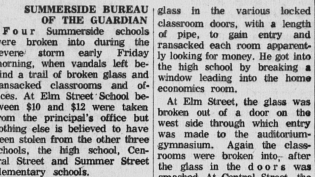

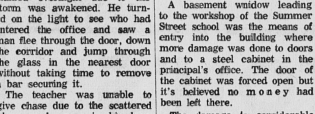

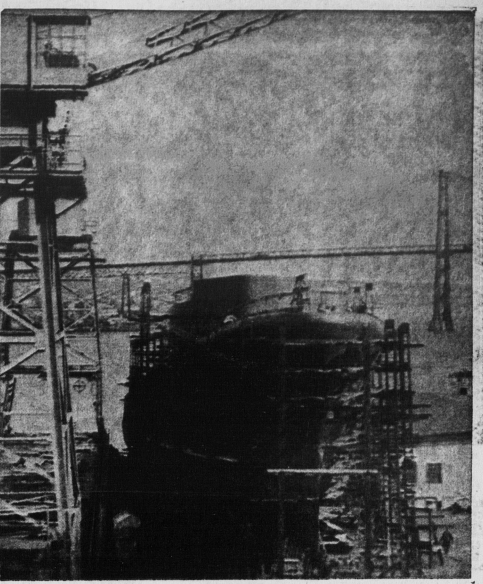
