**HALIFAX (CP)**—The weather office says showers and the occasional thunderstorms will likely reach the western limits of the Maritimes early today. A wedge of warm, moist air accompanying the disturbance will move across the three provinces during the day giving extensive coastal fog.

**Regional forecasts:**  
Halifax and vicinity, eastern shore: Cloudy and cooler; coastal fog; showers and chance of a thunderstorm beginning in afternoon; south winds 20. Low-high at Halifax 52 and 65, Goose 50 and 73. South shore, Annapolis Valley, Lower St. John River Valley: Cloudy; showers and chance of a thunderstorm; coastal fog; cooler; south winds 15. Low-high at Yarmouth 52 and 65, Kentville and Fredericton 55 and 73, Saint John 55 and 70.  
Northern Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Eastern N.B. Counties: Cloudy; showers and chance of a thunderstorm beginning in afternoon; coastal fog in the evening; little change in temperature; south winds 20. Low-high at New Glasgow 52 and 73, Charlottetown and Moncton 52 and 73.
