"keeper of the herds and lands". Born in 550 B. C. in the province of Shantung he writes in his book (Ninth Moon) "The Chrysanthemum has its yellow glory". The

name is derived from the Greek Chrysa (gold) and anthos (flower). This flower was introduced into England from the Orient in 754 and it has been used ever since as a hot-house flower but it is only in the last few years that the garden type has been perfected.

It is possible to grow many varieties of Mums suitable for a mass display in the Autumn, the bronzy and golden colored plants are especially good for this purpose.

Garden Mums are used for groups or drifts in the shelter of existing shrubbery planting or evergreens, and the Cushion Type-Mums and other dwarf sorts have distinct advantages for use as low edging for taller growing plants.

Masses of color, so readily obtainable in the Spring with many

of the early-blooming perennials and bulbs, have always been a problem for the late summer garden. The modern hardy mum fills this need to perfection, and now it is possible to have a lovely garden until the snows come.
