

# Step by step program for your wedding day

The wise bride will take plenty of time to plan her wedding so that she won't be rushed at the last minute.

Three months before the approximate date is a good time to begin preparations. At this

time decide whether the wedding will be formal or informal, and where the ceremony will take place. Decide what time of day will be best for the ceremony. Religion, climate, and local customs may be important

factors as well as plans for the wedding trip. Call on your clergyman with your fiance and set the wedding date.

Decide which friends you wish to have for attendants. You should have a maid or matron

of honor to hold your bouquets during the ring ceremony and to adjust your veil. You may also have bridesmaids, flower girls, pages, and a ringbearer.

Draw up your invitation list. Don't invite people that you don't really know, and never pay off social obligations at your reception.

### ENTER NAMES

Enter the names of your various lists on a card file designating each guest as to reception only, wedding only, or announcement. This makes checking acceptances easy and will be a useful reference list.

If the reception is to be held at a club, hotel, or other place apart from a private home an early reservation is necessary. Check the number you plan to invite. If you are having the reception at home get estimates from your florist, caterer, etc. Plan your wedding cake and the groom's cake.

Plan your future home and furnishings with your fiance. Choose your china, silver and glass patterns. Register with a gift consultant who will help you plan your tableware, linens and housewares. Enroll also with the bridal consultant of your favorite store.

Before deciding on your wedding dress consult your bridal magazines to see what styles are being worn. Your gown covers the time of wedding you have.

### SEES PROBLEMS

Choose your attendants' dresses. It is the bride's prerogative to choose the dresses without consulting her attendants, even though they must pay for them. The considerate bride bears in mind the budgets and any figure problems of her attendants.

At this time also order your invitations and remember to allow ample time for delivery. Or-

der any stationery you may want for use after your wedding.

Make plans for your wedding trip. Your groom makes all the arrangements, but if you plan to leave the country check on your passport and inoculations.

Begin to shop for your trousseau, remember that you will be wearing it for the first year of your married life. Have both mothers choose their gowns. The bride's mother has the privilege of choosing first as that she may have the color and style she prefers. The groom's mother then selects a gown of the same length and in a complementary color.

### TWO MONTHS BEFORE

Plan recording and display of gifts two months before the wedding. Most gifts will not arrive until invitations to the wedding are received, but it is wise to begin keeping records now and plan how you are going to display the gifts.

The addressing, stuffing, stamping and closing of the invitations and announcements should be done as early as possible. Decide upon gifts for attendants, these are usually of a personal and permanent nature. Make an appointment with your doctor for the required tests and a medical checkup. Go with your fiance to get the marriage license and check on waiting periods.

### SELECTED RING

Be sure the groom has selected the wedding ring and allowed time for engraving. Have your hair styled and get a permanent if necessary. All prep work in parties and showers given in your honor should take place two to four weeks before the wedding. Arrange transportation for the wedding party to the church and reception. Have the
