HUNTERS CORNER

This Past Fishing Season Has Been Disappointment

Our trout season, due to legal close on September 30th, has thirteen more days to go. . . un-lucky 13 for both the trout and trout fishermen. On the whole the past season has been a disappointment. There are a considerable number of anglers who have expressed the opinion that the uncertain behaviour of our trout this summer was due in no small degree to the two weeks extension. September 15th to 30th granted last season. They claim it cut deeply into our spawning run last fall and the effect was apparent this summer. This columnist has no opinion to express on this angle at the moment but I do feel certain that the two weeks extension granted last year cut deeply into our trout crop for this season and that the take during the last two weeks of the season this year will cut still deeper into the 1960 harvest.

The spawn must be ripe and the fish handled with tenderness and extreme care otherwise the losses among the parent stock will undo any advantage hoped to be gained. Angling for trout is a wonderful sport but why kill trout under the guise of sport that is either unfit for table use of fifty per cent below normal table quality? The angler who goes out from now until the end of September has no assurance as to the quality of the trout creel. It could be a fresh run trout, an in-between specimen or one that breaks down in the frying pan into a mess of insipid mush. An angler caught 7 trout at Grove Pine on Sunday, September 13th. One was a fresh run beauty, with firm red flesh. The others broke down in the frying pan into a mess as flat and tasteless as hake.

Sunday afternoon, September 13th, I had a long chat with Reg MacDonald, Souris. He announced that he was closing the Big Brook - Grove Pine area of Kings County to trout fishing on September 16th. He controls an extensive area of top trout water in this section of Kings and he made it quite plain to me that if anglers did not co-operate in this connection and made an attempt to angle in the waters prescribed until the legal end of the season—i.e. would prohibit public fishing in 1959. . . Period. If I were in his place I would do the same thing and I know of others who made it quite plain that they resented any angling for trout in waters controlled by them after September 15th. Personally I lose interest in fresh water trout fishing after August 31st.

I have had a lot of trout fishermen complain about the waste of trout this season extension caused. One reported catching a 2 1/2 pound trout that held so many eggs he could barely hold them in his two hands. He admitted that this trout was wasted. He is just one many such but the point is: What are they doing about having the season revert back to the fifteenth? The answer is contained in one word: "Nothing". Personally I opposed the extension and still am of the opinion it was a mistake and within a few years we will reap the harvest. . . fewer trout and harder to get. Once the natural reproduction of any species is tampered with the end of the road for this species is only a matter of time. Nature has her own laws governing reproduction and survival of her children and once those laws are violated the end may come sooner than one thinks.
