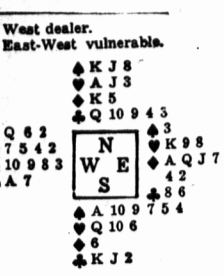
Harold Perry of Miscouche left on Tuesday, May 14, for Toronto, where he will spend some time.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

The bidding: West North East South Pass 1 1 1 1 Pass 2 4 Pass 4 4

Opening lead—ten of diamonds. This business of guessing the location of an adverse queen when a finesse for the queen may be taken in either direction is sometimes just a guess, but in the majority of cases is susceptible to a clearly indicated choice.

With the ten of diamonds led, South counts his losers and finds that he is threatened with a possible loser in each suit. But he also notes that he may not lose a spade, if he guesses correctly, or a heart, if the king of hearts is with West.

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must be devoted to keeping West out of the lead because a heart lead from him may be injurious. The ace of spades is led, and when both adversaries follow, another trump is led and the jack played. The finesse assures the contract regardless of who has the queen. If East has it, all that the opponents can get thereafter is the ace of clubs because two of South's hearts can be cast on the long club suit.

If South makes the mistake of going up with the king of spades he is defeated. As soon as West gets in with either a club or a spade he leads a heart to break the contract. All in all, the so-called mounts to a safety play to insure ten tricks.

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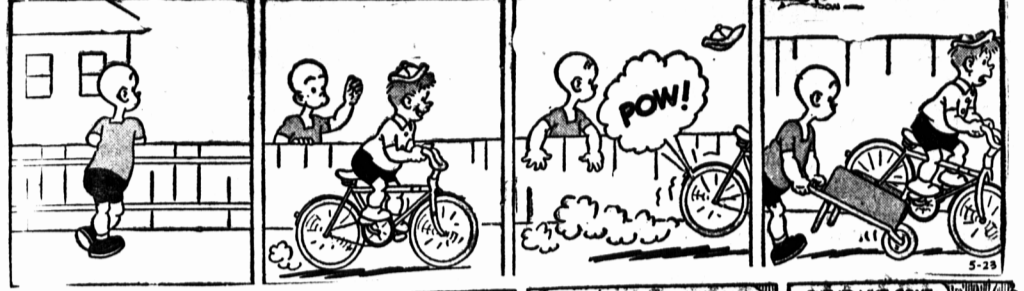
