**Broadcasting Stations Get Election Reminder**

 OTTAWA (CP)—You'd better not see Lester Pearson on television dressed like St. George and riding a white charger.  
 Or John Diefenbaker acting as crime-busting Elliot Ness.  
 If you do, somebody is in trouble with the Board of Broadcast Governors.  
 The board has issued a reminder to all broadcasting stations outlining the dos and don'ts for political broadcasts during the current campaign for the Nov. 8 federal election.  
 One of the prohibitions concerns "role playing." As the BBG puts it, "participants in a political program may not assume another role for the purpose of stimulating dialogue with political opponents."  
 Also under the ban is "unnecessarily theatrical" for a political broadcast are political cartoons, "still or animated," jingles and even background music unless that music is an integral part of some real filmed event, say the band at a political rally, being shown.  
**THREE-DAY SILENCE**  
 The Broadcasting Act prohibits political broadcasting on election day and the two days immediately preceding it. "Political broadcasting in this campaign must conclude at 12 mid night" on Nov. 5, 1965," the BBG says in its reminder.  
 Speeches by candidates are permitted after the polls have closed.  
 The latest reminder covers both free-time and paid political broadcasts and operations by individual stations and networks. It lays down rules for conflicting times for paid and free-time programs.  
 "No station may broadcast a paid political broadcast or announcement... in the same language during the time that a network free-time broadcast in the same medium is scheduled to be released in the same community."  
 "There is no objection if a radio station releases a paid political broadcast opposite a network free-time telecast, or to a paid political telecast being released opposite a network radio free-time broadcast."  
 The free-time and paid programs may be released at the same time where they are in different languages.  
**MUST DIVIDE TIME**  
 The amount of free time available to the political parties is reached at meetings of party representatives and the networks. The BBG notes that under the broadcasting regulations "stations are required to allocate time, whether free or sponsored, as equitably as possible between all parties and candidates."  
 The board also notes that "no speaker on any free-time political broadcast may be allowed to run overtime."  
 However, a candidate who gets carried away is to be let down as gently as possible.  
 "It is the responsibility of the manager of the originating station to make in each case appropriate arrangements which will allow a special announcement to be given with the least possible disturbance to the speaker."  
 The board sent out the latest reminder last week, including copies of other material it has provided on political broadcasting before previous elections.

**REGAIN LEAD**  
 LONDON (Reuters)—The Labor government regained the lead it lost last month to the opposition Conservative party in a public opinion poll published by The Daily Mail Friday. The Mail said 45.1 per cent of the people polled would vote for Labor if a general election were held now. This gave Labor a 2.6-per-cent edge over the Conservatives—who led by 3.7 per cent in last month's poll.
