Trading modest volumes. Crown Zellerbach slid 3/4 to 45 3/4 and Power Corporation dipped 2 points to 63.

Industrial volume was 75,800 shares, mines and oils, 1,377,000. The closing averages show banks up 0.16 at \$17.77, utilities off 0.6 at 140.2, industrials off 0.7 at 265.8, combined off 0.7 at 223.9.

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market took moderate losses Tuesday after a rise of eight straight days to new 1958 peaks.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 80 cents to \$175.30. Of 1,180 issues traded, 321 rose and 620 fell. Highs for the total 75. There were three new lows.

Volume slipped to 2,430,000 shares from 2,510,000 Monday. Canadian stocks moved fractionally on the New York exchange, International Nickel losing 1/2 on 6,800 shares.

American stock exchanges prices declined on volume of 840,000 shares compared with 910,000 Monday. Molybdenite and Jupiter Oils were gainers among Canadian stocks, each rising 1-1/16.

TORONTO (CP) - Profit-taking brought the sharp rise of speculative to an abrupt halt on the stock market Tuesday in heavy trading.

Final volume of 12,544,000 shares was the sixth heaviest in the market's history, but down considerably from Monday's record-making 15,699,000.

The five most active issues, all speculative, all lost. New Hosco, the big winner last week and on Monday, climbed to \$6.80 in early trading but slipped back to close off 30 cents at \$6.70.

This application for inspection is made on condition that the applicant:-

- 1. Will level off the bins and have them in shape for inspection and measurement or in the case of bagged potatoes have them readily accessible for inspection;
2. Will be present or represented when inspection is made and sign the report showing grade and contents of bins or quantity in lot;
3. Will not sell any of the inspected potatoes except for animal feed purposes;
4. Will not remove signs, marks or notices which may be placed on the applicant's property by the inspectors;
5. Will assist the inspectors in making their inspection.

Any failure on the part of the applicant to comply with the above conditions may render the application void.

The Agricultural Stabilization Board agrees;

- 1. To send inspectors to inspect and measure the potatoes as soon as possible after the application has been approved by the P. E. I. Potato Marketing Board.
2. The scale of measurement will be 2 1/2 cubic feet of potatoes per 100 pounds.
3. The percentage of Canada No. 1 grade will be determined by the inspectors upon such sample inspection as the inspectors deem necessary.

The Agricultural Stabilization Board does not assume responsibility for removing potatoes from bins or storage.

Payments will not be made by the Board in any case where the grower has less than 50 x 75 lbs. Canada No. 1 grade potatoes, nor where any lot grades less than 50% Canada No. 1.
