HALIFAX (CP) — The weather office says cold air burst over the Maritimes Tuesday and by late evening temperatures were in the teens at many points in all three provinces. Variable amounts of cloud and a few snowflurries were reported. The snowflurries were most frequent in Prince Edward Island and Eastern Nova Scotia.

A disturbance east of Cape Breton will move out to sea today while a high pressure area approaches from the west. This will give mostly sunny skies to the Maritimes although a few snowflurries are likely to persist in regions exposed to winds off the Gulf of St. Lawrence and the Bay of Fundy. Temperatures will rise to the 20s this afternoon.

The high pressure area will cross the district Thursday to give sunny and somewhat milder weather.
