HALIFAX (CP) — The weather office says a high pressure area over the Gulf of St. Lawrence will move slowly southeastward today giving rise to sunny skies in all three provinces. Island temperatures will climb into the 70s but sea breezes will keep them at coastal communities confined to the 60s or high 50s.

Annapolis Valley, Northern N.S., Eastern Shore, Cape Breton, Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick: Sunny with a few cloudy periods; warm inland but relatively cool coastal sections; light winds. High Hedges Banned At Town Intersections

SUMMERSIDE — Three motions and a by-law, all introduced by Councillor Grant Mollison, street committee chairman, were passed at a special meeting of Summerside Town Council last night.

The by-law states that it is unlawful for any owner or occupant of premises bordering along a street or street intersection, to erect a hedge, or other form of enclosure above a height of three feet.

The purpose of the by-law is to eliminate the danger at many intersections of the town because of the poor view afforded of oncoming traffic from adjacent streets.

A resolution was passed authorizing the street committee to call for tenders on the purchase of a half ton, one ton and five ton trucks.

Commenting on the resolution, Coun. Key stated that the town would be saving money by such a purchase and that the trading of present vehicles was long overdue.

Coun. Mollison pointed out that a lot of the cost to the town would have been reduced had the town traded its vehicles on a regular basis.

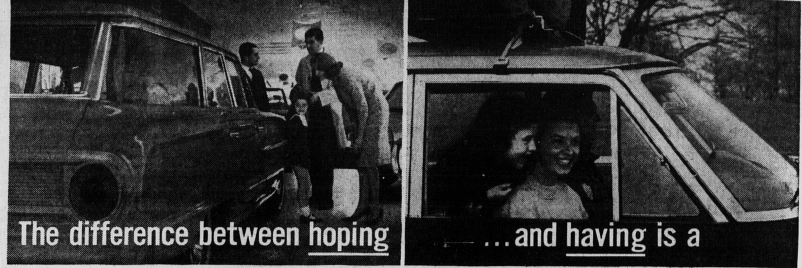
Purchase of an "economist vacuum applicator" was authorized. This is a device for the application of scotchlike facing in signs in the town. It is estimated that the \$345 machine will save the town approximately \$1.25 per sign in reduced maintenance costs.

WATER RATES
The tender by Curran and J. Briggs Ltd. for the patching of streets at \$19 per ton was accepted.

Commenting on the new water rate, Coun. Key stated that any town businessmen who came to the town council about the new rate would be "wasting their time" as the rate was set by the public utilities commission, not by the town.
