

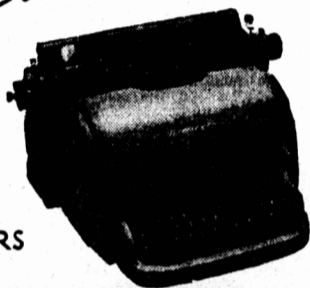

Strange But True

Elizabeth Gaunt was the last woman in England to be executed for a political offence. Generous to a fault, it was in keeping with selfless generosity that she gave succor to James Burton whose name was linked with the Rye House plot in 1683.

Elizabeth Gaunt admitted Burton to her home and hid him until she could help him escape to Holland.

Burton escaped, returned two years later, and after the Battle of Sedgemoor fled to London. There he denounced his benefactress to the government, appearing himself as the principal witness against her.

Tried at the Old Bailey in 1685 Elizabeth was found guilty and sentenced to be burned at Tyburn. William Penn and other notables attended the execution. The sight of the unfortunate woman arranging the straw about her so that she might burn the sooner, caused the onlookers to burst into tears.

Ravenstonedale Church has a window in memory of the woman who was burnt at the stake for sheltering a fugitive rebel.

Adam Walker, who was born in England in 1731, faced the world without ever having mastered his A.B.C.'s. Put to work while still a small boy, he used his spare moments in building himself a hut in the woods where he studied so diligently that he soon rose to a commanding position among his fellow men.

Because we happen to be born poor and denied any education except what is self-acquired should not prevent any of us from reaching the rainbow's end and the pot of gold providing we have the will to do.

With \$4, a pipe, a kit of clothes, and crutches, 55-year-old Lucien Rizenauer of Brussels, Belgium, went by shank's mare on a pilgrimage to Rome. The one-legged man covered 3000 miles through Europe on a one-year "pilgrimage of peace."

Although obliging car-drivers offered him lifts he said "no thumb" and continued on his way walking from 8 to 10 miles each day.

Lucien arrived in Lourdes on Christmas Day, and when he'd told his story to the bishop the good man immediately baptized him "pilgrim of the peace."

And what is still more amazing, Lucien traveled in 60 different countries, visited hundreds of celebrities, policemen, custom officials, etc., without a passport. The

long trek cost him 3 trousers, 2 jackets, and 8 right-foot shoes.

According to the National Geographic Society, the Micmacs are the earliest known inhabitants of Nova Scotia. They were encountered by the first explorers of the Northeast coast of America, among them Sebastian Cabot in 1497 and Sieur de Monts, Champlain, and Lescaurbot in 1605.

Today the Micmacs number about 3,400 and live on small reservations.

Jeremiah Campbellton, of Van Buren, Maine, who died last year at the advanced age of 105 years, was the last man to remember the Micmacs as a warlike race. When he was seven years old Campbellton was kidnapped by the Indians after they had burned his home.

The average male Canadian is 30 years old, has a wife and two children, and is plugging along to pay off the mortgage on the home he's purchased.

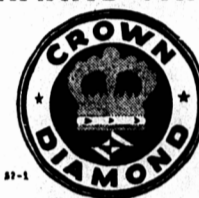
