A SNUG PROFIT—It is stated that the Toronto street railway last year made a net profit of \$104,000.

LATE CUBAN PAPER—Mr James Smith, of the Back Diamond, Liner Louisburg, has kindly sent THE EXAMINER copies of late Havana papers. Mr Smith was for years employed as steward on the Siasley.

THE RESULT OF TRICKERY—The Philadelphia Press publishes an exhaustive account of the investigation conducted by it at the dismantled workshop of the late J. W. Keeley. The Press contends that the result clearly proves the notorious Keeley motor to have been a delusion and a deception, and that the mysterious forces were the result of trickery.

A PRIZE WINNER—A prize of a thousand dollars offered by a New York newspaper at the beginning of 1898 for the most correct prophecies of what could happen during the ensuing year has been taken by a man who said there would be a successful war with Spain, a Republican Governor elected in New York and a bill passed to annex Hawaii. But he also predicted the abdication of Queen Victoria, the death of the Pope and a war between Russia and Japan.

NEWS FROM DAWSON—The steamer Daube arrived at Victoria last week, bringing about sixty men from Dawson and Athol with about \$400,000 in gold dust. The Dawson men say the Upper Dominion Creek is running on well, running from \$2.50 to \$4 to the pan. A great deal of typhoid fever is reported at Dawson, some say fully 800 cases. Seven men have been frozen to death in the Klondike this winter.

WANTED THE DIFFERENCE—A woman shoplifter was caught stealing an umbrella the other day in a Philadelphia dry goods store. But it was decided not to prosecute her if she paid for the umbrella, valued at \$2.50, which she did. The next day she returned and requested to see the manager. When that surprised person could recover himself sufficiently to ask her business the woman calmly told him that she had been pricing umbrellas in other stores and found that she could purchase one like her own for \$2, and she wanted to know if he could refund her 50 cents. As a tribute to her monumental nerve the 50 cents was handed her in silence.

THE PASPEBIAC STEAMERS—The Montreal Star's London correspondent cables that the long expected issue of stock of the Canadian Steamship Co., is now being made in connection with the inauguration of the Milford Haven-Pasphebiac service. Ordinary shares amounting to \$50,000 are not being offered to the public but 5 per cent debentures amounting to £200,000 and £100,000. Six per cent preference stock is being offered. The Atlantic and Lake Superior or Railway Company guarantees the principal and interest and undertakes to provide half a dozen steamers between Milford Haven, Liverpool and Pasphebiac.

MONEY IN FOOTBALL—The President of Yale University Football Association has made public a statement of revenue and expenditure for the season of 1897-98. The expenses include the guarantees paid, athletic goods, training table and all other items. The receipts include all gate receipts and guarantees received. The report was as follows: 1897-98—Receipts \$31,199.04, expenses \$16,648.49, balance \$14,541.55. 1897-98—Receipts \$40,437.16, expenses \$18,741.83, balance \$21,295.33. The net profits from the game of football at Yale during the past two seasons were \$35,837.91.

Customs Officer's Insurance.

OTTAWA, Ont., Jan. 20.—The Customs Department has nearly completed arrangements for placing its officers under guarantee bonds. The total amount of insurance is between \$900,000 and \$1,000,000.

The most numerous class among the audience were roistering apprentices.

On the stage and in other parts were fashionable dandies, swashbucklers, writers and actors. These, it is interesting to know, always had a free pass. The play lasted two hours on an average, and, considering the noise and the smells which accompanied the performance, one was, Mr. Collins presumed, not sorry when "the actors dropped on their knees to pray for the queen."
