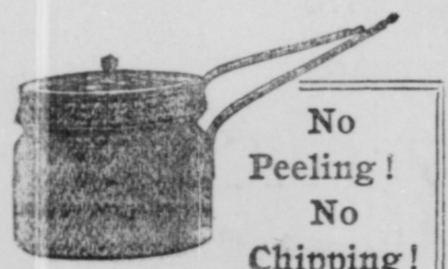

FOR THE WOMEN

Now and Then.

It is a question open to debate says the Canadian Home Journal whether in the household women are better off now with the present greater conveniences than they were fifty years ago. These improvements have brought their train a great multiplicity of things. The sewing machine can certainly fasten the fingers, but then greater elaborateness and profusion has been added to the work itself, so that the labors of the needle in the part about balances the result of the speed at the present time, and the same amount of precious time is taken up. Great gain, it is true, has come to the wearers of ready-made goods, but it is at the cost of the workers who in many cases are crowded down to the verge of starvation by the small wages they get. In cooking our present conveniences have lessened the labors in the kitchen, but now meals are prepared on a more elaborate scale which really put those of the age referred to into the class of plain lunches. Our rooms are now adorned with a great variety of "bric-a-brac" which were unknown in those days, and the dusting and caring for them is quite an item in the every day work of a housekeeper. We would not like to go back to the old state of affairs but let us not imagine that modern conveniences have lessened the labors of women to the extent that first appearances would have us believe.

How to Clean a Piano.

I heard not long ago of a lady who had been trying to find some way to clean her piano. It had a dark case with high polish, and had grown dull and milky looking, as well as finger marked.

She tried several preparations until finally some one told her to wash it with soap and water; but this she dared not do without consulting some one with experience.

A tuner was consulted, and he told her that it was the best way he knew of cleaning a piano case, provided proper care was exercised in doing the work. He then told her to have a pan of tepid soft water, a cake of the best white soap, and several pieces of cotton flannel of the poorest grade—that is sleazy and soft twisted.

One piece was to be used to apply the soap to the piano, first wetting the cloth and then rubbing it across the soap; afterwards applying it to the piano, rubbing over only a small place at a time. When using the last piece of cloth, it is necessary to rub briskly to give polish.

The whole case must be gone over in the same way and if the directions are carefully followed the piano will look like a new one; but if a stiff quality of cotton flannel is used, the polish will not be so fine and the surface will have a scratched appearance.—The Household.

Beautiful Finger Nails.

The ideal nails are those of an oval shape, with the "half moon" at the base fully developed. Except for this "half moon, which should be an almost lilac tint, the nails should be pink in color. They should be trimmed to correspond with the form of the tips of the tips of the fingers, neither too pointed nor too square.

The white edge of the nail should be only long enough to show a white edge beyond the pink portion. The surface of the nails should be smooth, and to a certain extent, polished. The skin which borders the nail all round is called the scarf-skin, and unless carefully watched is apt to push forward with the nail, which it gradually half covers.

Twice a week should be sufficient for the thorough manicuring of the fingertips, if the nails are frequently brushed when the hands are washed. The scarf skin should at the same time be gently pushed back with the towel.—McCall's Magazine.
