1. \$100 A MONTH FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

Up to \$125 monthly where needed, without a means test. Increased benefits for disabled persons, the blind, mothers, widows and others in need. NURSING HOMES constructed at suitable locations. MEDICAL CARE for all citizens; REHABILITATION

CENTRES for TREATMENT OF VICTIMS OF ALCOHOLISM. FREE SCHOOL BOOKS and planned construction of new schools. Pilot program of PROVINCIAL KINDERGARTENS at Charlottetown and Summerside.

2. EXTENDED COVERAGE UNDER MINIMUM WAGE ACT

A Minister of Labour will be appointed who will devote his full time to meet the needs of our working people. The minimum wage will be increased. Coverage to be extended to ALL MEN AND WOMEN... Labor Laws modernized to include VACAT-

IONS WITH PAY. Manpower training fully utilized. BETTER PAID JOBS through planned development of industry by and for Islanders.

3. SCHOOL TAX RELIEF

PROPERTY TAXATION under Shaw government has reached INTOLERABLE levels and MUST be REDUCED. A new Liberal government will appoint a commission IMMEDIATELY to study

problems of taxation with the objective of ABOLISHING urban and rural SCHOOL TAXES and finding equitable alternative means of financing education.

4. MODERN HOUSING PROGRAM

Crash program for Senior Citizens homes, LOW RENTAL HOMES and LOW COST DWELLINGS for people of average

incomes in URBAN and RURAL areas. Mortgage money for areas not now served.

5. ACTION FOR AGRICULTURE

A new Liberal government will place more emphasis on agricultural production than any other government in the history of P.E.I. Will appoint a DIRECTOR OF FARM LABOUR, place more emphasis and financial assistance to AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION and offer FARM MANAGEMENT COURSES. It will appoint more FIELD REPRESENTATIVES and ENGINEERS. Farm credit and mortgage loans greatly expanded. Legislation

will be passed to guarantee SPARE PARTS AND SERVICE for farm machinery. SEASONAL LICENSES for farm vehicles... a 20 percent silo construction subsidy, and assistance for land improvement, clearing, irrigation and drainage. FERTILIZER SUBSIDY paid and POTATO CROP INSURANCE improved, with protection of TABLE STOCK GROWERS from contact with ring rot. ARDA program put to work for farmers

6. FISHERIES MUST BE IMPROVED AND EXPANDED

New and existing fish processing plants encouraged and ISLANDERS assisted in this program. Freezing and storage facilities established for fishermen. DOWN PAYMENT FOR NEW BOATS, gear etc. reduced to 25%. Fire Fighting Equipment provided for fishing centres. A P.E.I. RESEARCH AND

PRODUCTIVITY COUNCIL established to find new uses for raw materials; modern production and marketing methods to ensure better prices for agriculture and fisheries products. More help for OYSTER INDUSTRY and promotion of TROUT FARMS.

7. SOUND AND EFFICIENT GOVERNMENT

EXTERNAL AUDIT of provincial revenues, expenditures and credit. Institute improved budgetary controls. Public works contracts and government purchasing conducted by tenders,

publicly opened. FEDERAL-PROVINCIAL RELATIONS improved to obtain many more millions for provincial treasury. ... Voting age lowered to 18.

8. FIVE-YEAR ROAD-BUILDING PROGRAM

To assure fair treatment to ALL DISTRICTS. Paved highways more adequately maintained and brought to all-weather standards to Tignish and East Point, and other major centers. Full use

of Federal monies for paving roads to Fishing Centres and Resources.

9. PROVINCIAL CENTENNIAL PROJECT

To celebrate Canada's 100th. Birthday and make our garden province more attractive, greater assistance will be given to the

Rural Beautification Program and enlarge program for brightening homes and buildings; encourage more widespread gardening.

10. TOURISM, GOLF COURSES AND PARKS

The Causeway will greatly expand demand for tourist accommodation and recreation. Training courses for employees in Tourist industry established in all counties. Golf Courses for

Prince and Kings counties. Negotiations for National Parks in Prince and Kings.

11. INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT

Will establish P.E.I. RESEARCH AND PRODUCTIVITY COUNCIL with our own scientists, industrialists, clergy, labour and business leaders, to find new uses for our raw materials and apply modern production and marketing methods for exist-

ing and new industries. Establish these industries in co-operation with Private enterprise through TOTAL use of Federal incentive programs. Greater efforts to assist our own citizens to modernize, expand, establish local industry in every district.

12. ELECTRIC POWER

Costs must be reduced to improve competitive position of existing and new industries. Studies and negotiations will be

undertaken to ensure earliest possible availability of such power in quantity.
