The End of Abdallah Pacha.

A Martyr to Conviction.

TROUBLE IN CAIRO.

Wolseley Determined!

Special Dispatch to the Examiner.

ALEXANDRIA, Sept. 20.

Abdallah Pacha will no longer complicate matters in the campaign. Two regiments had been ordered to proceed to Damietta, and some of the war vessels were to take part in subduing the refractory Commander of the Garrison. He was strongly entrenched in his position and had five or six thousand of the black Egyptian troops in the fort. On hearing of the determined advance of the British and soon expecting them before his fort, he called his soldiers together to-day and addressed them, urging them to resist the invader to the last, to fight against great odds for the honor and the liberty of their country, and to give up their lives in defence of both it and religion, begging his soldiers also to follow his own example in offering his life to the prophet and the country. The soldiers were silent, and the address did not inspire a spirit of patriotism among them. A soldier took Abdallah Pacha at his word, put his rifle to his shoulder, and shot the Commander of Damietta dead. That is virtually the end of the difficulty at Damietta.

News reaches here of rumored disturbances in the Arab quarters in Cairo. The roughs of the place had been troublesome and threatening, and had openly broken out in rebellious proceedings. Sir Garnet soon restored order by his prompt determination in announcing that he would at once open fire from the citadel if the troubles were renewed.

Russia and Montenegro.

Quickest on Record!

LONDON, Sept. 20.

News has been received here that an offensive and defensive alliance between Russia and Montenegro has been concluded. The affair causes some surprise, as it is likely not to make matters smooth when the time arrives for settling the Eastern Question.

The steamship "Alaska," from New York on the 12th, made the passage in six days, fifteen hours and nineteen minutes. The passage is another of the fastest on record.

Enthusiastic Reception of the Vice-Regal Party.

Fears of Foundering.

MONTREAL, Sept. 20.

The Vice-Regal party reached Victoria last evening in the war ship "Comus." The party landed to-day, and were received with the most enthusiastic reception ever given in the Province. The road from Esquimalt to Victoria, more than three miles in length, was spanned by arches and garlands, and presented one of the most joyous and picturesque sights ever seen here. More than ten thousand strangers were in town to witness the arrival of the Governor-General and the Princess.

It is feared that the schooner "Willie Sherwood," which left Owen Sound on the 12th inst., has foundered in the late storms. Nothing has since been heard about her. She had a crew consisting of five persons.
