Island Odds And Ends

Few of the displaced persons who came to this Province are remaining in farm employment, and practically all leave for Upper Canada as soon as they complete the specified year in agricultural work. Probably a hundred or more of these homeless people came to our Province in the past three years, and at present not more than 20 are still here, and the number is decreasing each month.

Dutch farmers are moving in to take the place of the D.P.'s, but are arriving in small groups. There are better prospects however that the Dutch immigrants, all of whom pay their own way to Canada, will establish permanent homes in P. E. Island. All of them, or 90% at least are skilled farmers, and know no other calling. They like farming and are accustomed to the hard work it requires. The D.P.'s on the other hand were not farmers, for the most part, but were required to do a year's work on a farm conditional to entry into Canada.

This stipulation was made at a time when farm labor across the Dominion was very scarce, and when many of our ex-service men were not re-established. It was hoped to fill the gaps on the farms and at the same time leave city job opportunities open to our own returned soldiers.

Unfortunately the D.P.'s seem to have a hankering for City life and have moved into our more populous centres like Toronto and Montreal in large numbers. Complaint is being made about them that they work for low wages, to the annoyance of the native-born. Whether this is so or not, they will in time be absorbed into the main stream of Canadian life, and as like as not become strong trade-unionists. It happened that way in the United States, a country which was built up in its early days on cheap European labor. The offspring of these same laborers are today advocates of high wages or big business men cutting a figure in the national life. The parents or grandparents of scores of prominent Americans came to America steerage class.

As for the Dutch, they not only pay their passage to Canada, they bring as much good hard currency with them as the Netherlands government will permit. Eventually most of them expect to purchase farms in Canada, and some have already done so in P. E. Island. Since they are productive farmers every one who takes over land in this Province is a distinct asset.

Mr. G. L. Sanderson who has been active in St. Peter's as secretary of the Canadian Legion, has opened a service station in the village. The station is newly built and should be handy for the motoring public. It is moreover an addition to the village as well.

Because of our dependence on Hollywood for entertainment we are not as well informed as we might be as to what other countries produce in stage and screen circles. Harry Lauder's name of course is internationally known as is that of Maurice Chevalier, the French star, but there are many others of a younger generation with great talent, who are overshadowed by people with lesser ability, but greater publicity - Hollywood publicity.

Since the Canadian National Railways took over in Newfoundland fares have been sharply reduced. Thousands of Newfoundlanders in the low income brackets are now able to ride the rails for the first time. Visitors to the new Province saw trains bound for St. John crowded to the limit with people for their first look at the new Province. Since there are few motor roads into the interior and these very short - about 20 miles - the railroad will be the chief means of travel for most people for years to come.

The Newfoundlanders still stick to some old and perhaps very good customs. Banks and many business houses close for an hour and a half each day at noon. Everybody leaves for the midday meal at the same time. There is not much wrong with this idea but it wouldn't suit this farming country. Farmers, shopping in Charlottetown or doing other business would not relish the idea of waiting for the stores and banks to re-open.

The highway from Cardigan leading to the Seven-Mile Road is being rebuilt, perhaps to be paved at a later date. The work started at D. A. Acorn's garage at the north end of the bridge and is being continued past the Catholic Church and beyond. Road-makers are also making ready to harden the surface of the four or five mile stretch from Roseneath Corner to Georgetown thus connecting that town with the Charlottetown to Montague pavement. This should put Georgetown on the map for many an automobile driver, who now avoids the secondary road to that place especially if pleasure driving.

Some day the question of leasing fishing ponds and streams in the Province may bring on a legal battle. It is a fit subject for discussion and decision whether a few people should be able to fence off the better fishing spots in this compact and most accessible small Province for their own use. Even if legal, it can hardly be called democratic or in the best sporting tradition. This is not New Brunswick with its long rivers and wide sweeps of lake dotted country.

At the present time the two best trout ponds in Queen's County are leased to two groups of people, and off limits to hundreds of fine
