**CONTRACT BRIDGE**

East dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

The bidding:  
East South West North  
Pass 2NT Pass 3NT

Opening lead—jack of clubs. Some objections may be lodged against South's two notrump bid in the ground his hand did not include a diamond stopper, but so far as this column is concerned, the bid appears to be proper.

The fact of the matter is that while certain bids are supposed to meet certain standard requirements, the cards are not always dealt so that each hand fits exactly into a slot conveniently supplied by the theorists.

Thus, it does not seem to us that a club bid is satisfactory with a hand containing 24 high card points. There is too much danger partner may pass with 3, 4, or 5 points.

Nor does the hand qualify as a forcing two club bid which could lead to a hopeless game contract.

To top it off, a two notrump opening is prohibited by the purists who insist there must be positive stoppers in all four suits.

The answer is that no bid chosen is perfect, and therefore the bid that should be selected is the one to which there can be the least objection, namely, two notrump.

An examination of all four hands reveals the contract can be defeated with perfect defense. The defenders can grab four diamond tricks and then sit and wait for the setting trick in either spades or clubs.

However, bridge is not played in a vacuum and the defenders don't always know their own strength. A weakness in declarer's armor that is known to him may be utterly unknown to the defenders during the early play.

South traded upon this advantage as declarer, and succeeded in stealing the contract. He allowed the jack of clubs to win the opening lead, being careful to drop the seven from his own hand.

West read his partner's six as a signal to continue the suit. He thought his partner had either the three or four, or both. So he led the ten of clubs and South scampered home with nine tricks.

Had declarer taken the first club, it would have become much easier later for West to shift to diamonds.
