U.S. Marines Set Up Force

SAIGON (AP) — A thousand U.S. marines landed near North Viet Nam Sunday to set up a blocking force for an operation aimed at a North Vietnamese Army division.

B-52 bombers from Guam backed the operation with a saturation attack on suspected enemy hiding places, about eight miles south of the demilitarized zone separating North and South Viet Nam.

The marines and South Vietnamese reported killing 153 soldiers since the operation began Friday. Fourteen marines were killed when ground fire brought down a troop-carrying helicopter. Up to five helicopters have been reported damaged or destroyed.

The U.S. command in Saigon reported U.S. jets flew 121 missions over North Viet Nam Saturday. The raids focused on oil depots — two only a few miles north of the border — water traffic, bridges and highways.

Meanwhile, President Ho Chi Minh of North Viet Nam has ordered partial mobilization of reserve officers and civilians. The Viet Cong announced they, too, would intensify operations.

Astronauts: Navy Cmdr. John W. Young and Air Force Maj. Michael Collins, both 35.

Launch time: Atlas to boost Agena target satellite at 4:41 p.m. (EDT). Titan 2 to boost Gemini 10 at 6:21 p.m.

Length of flight: 30 hours 17 minutes.

Goal: Rendezvous and dock with Agena, using its engine to manoeuvre for later rendezvous with an Agena left in space last March by the Gemini 7 flight, two space walks by Collins, 14 scientific and technological experiments.

Even with the interruptions, Steel says production of ingots and castings for the week ended July 16 was about 2,300,000 net tons, compared with this year's high point of 2,376,000 tons for the week ended May 14.
