

Pound Convertibility Move Expected Soon

 LONDON (AP)—Financial circles predicted Wednesday that Prime Minister Macmillan's government will move swiftly toward full convertibility of the pound sterling.

The pound has been subjected to government control since 1939 but now most of these have gone, Macmillan, with a sweeping election victory behind him, is believed anxious to get rid of the rest.

Informants said the government's next step will be to sweep away the remaining restrictions on dollar imports. This action has been urged by the United States and Canada.

Once the restrictions are dropped Britons will be able to buy unlimited quantities of U.S. and Canadian goods.

ONE BARRIER

Then only one major barrier would remain—the one prohibiting residents of Britain from exporting capital as they wish. Even this provision is not as stringent as it sounds, the sources explained, since businessmen can receive permission to spend money abroad to establish new enterprises.

The restriction on exporting capital may take longer to abolish. It is kept on the books to prevent a sudden international development touching off a run on the pound. A run would be dangerous because as much as half of the world's trade and payment is conducted in sterling.

Earlier this week Macmillan's cabinet eased currency restrictions on holiday travel. From now on any Briton will be able to obtain automatically up to £250 a year in any foreign currency including dollars for travel and can get more on application to the bank of England.

The previous travel allowance was £100.

TOURIST BOOM

The removal of this restriction is expected to have considerable impact on the tourist business in the United States and Canada. Until now it has been almost impossible for Britons to travel in the dollar countries except for business or educational purposes.

Removal of dollar import restrictions, once it comes, should stimulate the sales of such things as automobiles, clothes, and household furnishings made in the United States and Canada.

Anticipating this step, the Financial Times said: "Once this has been done—and there is every reason why it should be done soon—the final remnants of the defence structure of a besieged Britain will have been razed."

Rocket Team Lost To Army

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower decided Wednesday to strip the army of its rocket development team and turn it over to the civilian space agency. He said this would strengthen the national space effort.

"I have concluded that the army ballistic missile agency can best serve the national interest as an integral part of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration," Eisenhower announced.
