Grain Crop Prospects Good In Western Canada

OTTAWA, July 14 (CP) - The Bureau of Statistics has placed the numerical condition of Canada's 1951 spring wheat crop at June 30 at 109, compared with 83 at the same stage of 1950 crop. The numerical condition of crop is expressed as a percentage of the long-time average yield per acre for each crop.

The 1951 numerical condition of winter wheat was estimated at 90, compared with 90, and of all wheat 109, compared with 83. Other major crops, with 1950 figures in brackets, were: Oats 98 (89); barley 97 (85); fall rye 91 (71); spring rye 97 (81); all rye 83 (74); flaxseed 95 (86).

By provinces, the numerical condition of the spring wheat crop, with 1950 totals in brackets was: Manitoba 96 (99); Saskatchewan 106 (91); Alberta 123 (59).

Other all-Canadian totals of numerical condition: peas 98 (90); beans 97 (91); buckwheat 98 (97); mixed grains 102 (96); shelled corn 92 (92); potatoes 97 (90); turnips 97 (91); hay and clover 106 (81); alfalfa 104 (82); fodder corn 95 (94); sugar beets 94 (87); pasture 107 (89).

Condition of provincial cereal crops on the Prairies other than wheat was: Manitoba - oats 94 (85); barley 96 (86); rye 92 (84); flaxseed 94 (86).

Saskatchewan - oats 96 (93); barley 100 (94); rye 90 (72); flaxseed 97 (86).

Alberta - oats 96 (75); barley 96 (76); rye 99 (71); flaxseed 98 (75).

Land Prices Skyrocket In Edmonton Area

EDMONTON, July 14 (CP) - Industrial development around booming Edmonton has sent land prices skyrocketing. Farm land originally priced at \$50 a acre is selling to oil companies and industrial firms for up to \$1,500 an acre.

"Land prices have gone haywire," said Louis Plotkin, technician for the Edmonton District Planning Commission.

G. H. Milligan, district supervisor for the Calgary Power Company, said farmers are asking "utterly ridiculous" prices for their land. His company bought 43 acres for a power sub-station and is reported to have paid nearly \$30,000 for the land.

The greatest price jumps have occurred in the prosperous Clover Bar district less than 30 miles east of Edmonton. Three oil refineries have been built in the area and several chemical industries are expected to locate there.

New Dairy Spread Tried In Quebec

QUEBEC, July 13 (CP) - It looks and tastes something like butter; but it isn't.

That was the verdict of people who tried a "spread" manufactured at Ste. Anne de la Perade and on sale today in Quebec grocery stores.

But it doesn't conflict with Quebec legislation banning margarine and butter substitutes, says its maker, J. Thibault, head of Fromage Champlain-Incorporee.

There was a minor flurry of excitement when the product (Champlain Spread) was spotted on grocery-store shelves, at 45 cents a pound compared with 65 for butter.

The Attorney-General's Department, watching for violations of the 1950 anti-margarine law, said it would investigate.

One of the differences between his product and margarine, said Mr. Thibault, is that his product contains a 20-per-cent proportion of powdered milk. Another difference is that it can't be used as a frying fat.

A. P. Reporter's Confession

NEW YORK, July 14 (AP) - The voice of Associated Press correspondent William N. Oatis, recorded during his trial on espionage charges in Communist Czechoslovakia was heard Thursday by American radio listeners.

NBC recorded parts of the Prague trial and flew the recordings to New York.

Oatis, condemned to 10 years imprisonment on Wednesday spoke in a clear, steady voice. Oatis' voice emerged amid a mélange of Czech spoken by the Communist prosecutor and judge and a woman interpreter.

The 37-year-old newspaper man was asked whether his behavior was unusual for Westerners in Czechoslovakia. "No, it wasn't," he answered. "The fact is that I found out that most members of the Western press and diplomatic colony were doing espionage, and for that reason it was difficult for me not to fall into it."

The woman interpreter asked whether Oatis acted according to instructions from Nathan Polowetzky, his immediate predecessor as AP correspondent in Prague.

"Partly, yes," Oatis replied. "As soon as I came here, I checked on the reliability of the employees by talking to them personally and I found that these employees were willing to undertake espionage tasks for me."

A. I. Goldberg, AP correspondent who set up the Prague bureau after the Second World War, and Henry C. Cassidy, NBC director of radio news, commented during the program.

Goldberg said: "I've been a reporter for 31 years, most of that time for the Associated Press. I've never been a spy. People in the free world, of course, know the difference."
