World Council Of Churches Is Topic At St. Paul's WA

All doubts as to spiritual values resulting from the World Council of Churches meeting at New Delhi in December, were dispelled as the Rev. David MacDonald gave his impressions of the meeting to a large and deeply interested group of Anglican W.A. members in St. Paul's hall on Thursday, January 25th. Mr. MacDonald was introduced by Mrs. E. J. East, Chairman, President of Branch A.—as a graduate of Dalhousie and Pine Hill colleges and a recently ordained Minister of the United Church. He was chosen because of his outstanding qualities in youth leadership to be one of the five youth participants attending from Canada, and he was also a free lance representative of the CBC. The audience soon felt that this choice had been amply justified, as with thoughtful ease and buoyancy, Mr. MacDonald carried his listeners through the breath-taking events of the three-day meeting of world Christian leaders and statesmen and their historic merger with the International Missionary Society. With coloured illustrations the speaker brought us in touch with such differing personalities as—Prime Minister Nehru and the Archbishop of Canterbury (both of whom he met personally), Pastor Martin Niemöller, Bishop Debelius, and the Greek Orthodox Archbishop—Takovos, also five observers sent from the Vatican.

The theme studied by the 626 delegates and an equal number of observers was "Jesus Christ, the Light of the World", with the aim in view of promoting Unity, Witness and Service among all Christian people. One of the highlights was the great open air service of Holy Communion in which Anglican, Protestant and Orthodox members received the sacrament together. Group discussions showed diversity of opinions but a keen desire to find a common meeting ground of unity. The youth groups, headed by Mr. MacDonald, thought this could best be obtained by starting in their own local parishes and by sharing the highest contribution of ideals in each denomination. The Greek motto which faced the Assembly at all times was Oikoumene (One House).

One way in which Christian witness has failed was voiced by Sir Francis Dham, Governor of Nigeria in which he made a bitter attack upon white Westerners for their lack of friendship with coloured Asians and Africans. A more cheering note in the Conference was the compassion shown by all delegates for Refugees and InterChurch Aid, as a million and a quarter dollars was voted for this cause. An interesting side light of Mr. MacDonald's trip was the fact that two fellow students from Dalhousie accompanied him to the meeting. While there, the two girls were so impressed with the misery and need of the natives in New Delhi, that they gave up continuing their proposed world trip and volunteered to work as technicians in the Indore hospital.

Ven Archdeacon J.T. Ibbott opened and closed the meeting with prayer, and the Rev. Norman Norris thanked the speaker for his stirring address.

Refreshments were served and the young speaker was surrounded with many friends who were justly proud of his being the only observer from Charlottetown at the Conference. It was hoped that he may have many opportunities to share his experience with young Canadians, inspiring them to go forward in the service of the Master.
