Stepped Up Talks Seen On German Peace Treaty

LONDON (Reuters) — Stepped-up consultations on the West's proposals for a Soviet peace treaty were foreseen in European capitals Sunday.

Little change in the Soviet position emerged from the Washington meeting, the sources said, and the West now can get down to hard work on answering the Russian proposals.

German experts should be called in to assist it. Diplomatic sources in London said Sunday there is some evidence now that Britain might accept representatives of East and West Germany at a four-power meeting if the Germans were only technical experts and did not participate fully.
