Mets, Colts, Cubs Stage Surprise Upsets Saturday

NEW YORK (CP) — Only a dreamer would pick New York Mets to beat Milwaukee Braves, Houston Colts to beat Los Angeles Dodgers, and Chicago Cubs to beat San Francisco Giants all on the same day. But that's just what happened Saturday when the amazing Mets defeated the Braves 2-1, the Colts clobbered the Dodgers 9-6 and the Cubs shut out the Giants 4-0. In other National League games, Pittsburgh Pirates edged Cincinnati 4-2 and Philadelphia Phillies thrashed St. Louis Cardinals 6-2. In the American League, Boston Red Sox came up with three runs in the last of the 13th inning to offset two by Detroit Tigers in the top half of the inning, for a 4-3 victory. Chicago White Sox outslugged Minnesota Twins 10-7 and Baltimore Orioles whipped Cleveland Indians 5-1.

losers Johnny Podres and his successors for 10 hits. Rookie catcher John Bateman drove in a pair of Houston runs with a single and a double as the Dodgers chipped in with two errors—both by shortstop Maury Wills—a balk and a pair of wild pitches. Bob Buhl and Lindy McDaniel combined to pitch a three-hit shutout against the Giants. Buhl gave up a single to pinch-hitter Matty Alon in the sixth and a single to Jose Pagan in the eighth. Jim Davenport singled off McDaniel in the ninth. Southpaw Billy Pierce was the loser. Roy Sievers, back in the lineup after being sidelined with a rib injury, batted in three runs with a triple and double as the Phillies snapped a four-game losing streak at the expense of the Cardinals. Marcelino Lopez, 19-year-old southpaw, scored his first major league victory although he needed help from Jack Baldwin. Ray Sadecki was the loser. Pittsburgh's Bob Friend spun a four-hitter for his second victory against the Reds. Joey Jay dropped his third decision for Cincinnati. The Pirates got 10 hits including three by catcher Jim Pagliaro. Dave Nicholson drove in five runs with a triple and grand slam homer to lead the White Sox to victory over the Twins. Bob Allison had a three-run winning rally for the Red Sox. The Tigers had scored twice in the top of the 14th as Bill Brunton's bases-loaded single.

GAINS TOP SPOT
The victory gave Baltimore first place in the American League. The crusty leaders, Kansas City Athletics, dropped a 7-4 decision to Los Angeles Angels, and Washington Senators trounced New York Yankees 7-1. Alvin Jackson pitched a seven-hitter as the Mets extended their winning streak to two, both victories coming at the expense of the Braves. Warren Spahn was the Braves' loser. The 42-year-old southpaw was clipped for nine hits in seven innings, including a home run by catcher Norm Sherry. Gil Hodges drove in the Met's first run with a single, his first hit of the season. Don Notchbart pitched his second victory as the Colts pounded

Ingo Gets Up From Canvas For Victory

STOCKHOLM (AP) — A groggy Ingemar Johansson got up from the canvas Sunday night to be declared winner on points over Britain's Brian London in a 12-round heavyweight boxing match here. London, the former British Empire champion, stunned Johansson with a vicious left hook that felled the Swede glassy-eyed in the last minute of the fight. Johansson came up on unsteady legs. The referee was cut short on the count of four by the final bell. Before the sensational final round there had been no knockdowns in the fight for which Johansson was a standout favorite. The Swede did not stake his European title. Johansson showed obvious signs of ring-rust, not having a fight since last June 17, regained the European heavyweight crown he relinquished in 1959 as world champion. The referee who gave Johansson a victory as sole arbiter was experienced Irishman Andrew Smythe, referee of previous Johansson fights. London weighed 207½ pounds and Johansson 20½ pounds.

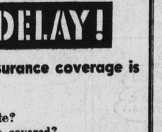

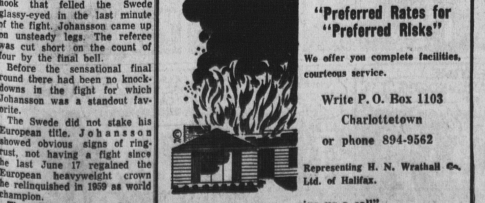
