TORONTO (CP) - The stock market faded in the final 15 minutes Wednesday to close mixed to higher in moderately active trading.

Base metals posted an index of less than one-quarter of a point, while western oils lost nearly three-quarters of a point.

Uranium lost some ground early in the day but closed mixed. Coppers and western oils were quiet with few outstanding changes.

Index changes: golds off .01 to .07; base metals up .16 to .07; western oils off .69 to .04.

Provincial Legislatures Face Rising Expenditures

Three legislatures are in session now and the rest will meet by March 11. Their accomplishments seem likely to be overshadowed by what happens in federal politics.

Financing the rising cost of provincial administration is their major common problem. The federal government has announced an increase of \$87,203,000 in payments to the provinces but formal revision of tax may be delayed by a dominion election.

Provincial participation in the national health insurance plan also is due for wide attention. VARIOUS TOPICS

Proposals range from putting all Saskatchewan on Mountain Standard Time to changing the method of making school grants in Ontario; from permitting Sunday sports in Vancouver to changing some place-names in Quebec to French from English.

A cross-Canada survey by The Canadian Press gives this picture of what is happening coast to coast.

NEWFOUNDLAND
The legislature opened Jan. 20. Premier Smallwood predicted a quiet session.

Most important business mentioned in the throne speech, prepared by the Liberal government, was legislation to give Crown Zellerbach Corporation of San Francisco the right to explore crown lands with a view to setting up new pulp and paper mills.

Other legislation would add free hospital medical services for children under 16 years to the free hospital care they already receive.

NOVA SCOTIA
Opens Feb. 12. A legislative committee studying all phases of hospital insurance may report during the session. This is expected to be the major issue.

Highway construction was a major election plank of the governing Progressive Conservative party headed by Premier Stanfield. Another issue will be financial arrangements between the province and municipalities.

DEBATE
Debate is expected also on possible new aid for depressed areas like Springfield and Westville.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND
Opens March 11. As in Nova Scotia, hospital insurance is expected to be a major issue. Debate is likely on a proposal for a causeway across Northumberland Strait to connect Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick.

P.E.I. has a Liberal government headed by Premier A. W. Matheson.

NEW BRUNSWICK
The second legislature session since the Progressive Conservative Premier Fleming was re-elected in 1956 is expected to open early in February and continue for seven weeks.

The legislative program is expected to be light. The medical council of New Brunswick wants to consolidate and clarify the act under which it functions. The Union of New Brunswick Municipalities wants uniform observance of daylight time. The government's reaction is not known.

QUEBEC
Opened last Nov. 13. Legislation so far passed includes bills to increase farm loans and housing aid, extend rent control to May 1, 1959, increase the number of judges in court of sessions.

REORGANIZATION
Reorganization of the provincial jail service to increase vocational and apprenticeship education also will be proposed.

A bill to permit Sunday sport in Vancouver is in prospect. Heated debate is anticipated on merits of a government deal permitting the Swedish Wenner-Gren interests first rights to develop a vast area in Northern British Columbia.

CLASH WITH GUERRILLAS
MADRID (Reuters) - Spanish troops killed 21 Guerrilla fighters in a day-long battle Monday in the Spanish Sahara region, an army communique said Wednesday. The communique said Spanish casualties totalled 51 dead and wounded.

10 DIE IN FLOODS
ALGIERS (Reuters) - Ten persons were reported Wednesday to have died in floods in the Philippeville area of eastern Algeria. Helicopters are being used to rescue persons cut off by the floods, caused by 48 hours of storms.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market Wednesday lost about a third of its rise of the last two sessions in moderate trading.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell 80 cents to \$164.20 with industrials down \$1.60 rails down 50 cents and utilities unchanged.

Volume totalled 2,490,000 shares compared with 2,970,000 Tuesday.

For the sixth straight day, Royal Dutch topped the most active list, off 1/4 at 40 1/4 on 76,000 shares.

Merritt - Chapman and Scott, which raised its dividend, was second as it rose 1/4 to 19 1/4 on 45,000 shares. This was General Dynamics, up 1/4 at 62 1/2 on 33,800 shares.

Among Canadian issues on the New York exchange, Walker-Gooderham gained 1 and Hudson Bay Mining 3/4. Losers included Aluminaria Ltd., R. Canadian Pacific and McIntyre Porcupine 1/4 each, and Dome Mines 1/4.

In a quiet Canadian section of the American exchange, Preston East Dome gained 1/2 and Jupiter Oils 1-1/8.
