MONTREAL (CP)—The U. S. dollar closed Thursday at a discount of 3-16 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 1-32. It took 96-9-16 cents Canadian to buy \$1 American. Pound sterling \$2.68 15-16, up 1-16.

N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market made its third straight advance Thursday, but the showing was not very convincing. There were wide moves by a few stocks, but the great majority showed narrow changes either way.

Shortly before the closing bell, selling brought down several leaders, especially in the railroad division, and the market closed under its best. Ralls as a group were lower.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced 20 cents at \$51.10. Volume came to 2,210,000 shares.

Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP)—The stock market was steady to fractionally active trading Thursday. Miscellaneous industrials, papers and utilities were slightly improved and senior metals were narrowly mixed. The remainder of the industrial market was generally unchanged.

United Asbestos improved 50 cents at \$6.50 and Coltes was up 1-2 cents at \$2 cents in a mixed mine section. Sullivan was off 50 cents at \$5.25 and Baska at 60 cents eased 13 cents. Western oils were dull and featureless.

The stock exchange's closing averages show banks up 0.02 at 47.84, utilities unchanged at 117.8, industrials up 0.9 at 245.7, combined up 0.6 at 203.1, papers off 1.33 at 1184.16 and golds off 1.39 at 68.13.

Active Issue

Baltimore and Ohio was the day's most active issue up 1 at 39½. It was followed by Pennsylvania Railroad unchanged, Armco up ¼, Libby, McNeill and Libby up ¼ and TXL Oil up ½ at 38¼.

Douglas Aircraft was the star performer with a gain of 4½ at 127½ after directors raised the dividend, declared an extra and proposed a three-to-two split.

Commonwealth Edison added 2½ at 47½ following a favorable internal revenue tax decision. Atlantic Coast Line fell 3 and Louisville and Nashville gained 1.

Among stocks advancing with net gains were General Motors up 1½, Boeing 1, Radio Corp. 1½, American Telephone ¾, Kennecott Copper ¾, Westinghouse Electric 1, Bullard 1, Cincinnati Milling 1½, and Houston Oil ½.

Lower Stocks

Lower were Bethlehem Steel off ¾, Anacosta Copper ¾, Allied Chemical 1, International Paper ¾, Santa Fe 2, Southern Railway ¾ and Texas Co. ¾.

Among Canadian stocks, Dome Mines and Distillers Seagram each advanced ¼ while Canadian Pacific lost ½ and McIntyre was down ¼.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP)—Some lower-priced mines shot ahead on the stock market Friday but overall price movements were small and irregular.

The session was the ninth straight of heavy mines trading. During the last nine sessions market volume has not fallen below 6,000,000 shares and each day the ticker tape has lagged in recording floor sales.

Algom Uranium touched \$15.25, ending at \$16 for a 1.50 gain on the day on turnover of 23,000 shares. Brokers reported rumors the company had completed multi-million-dollar financing with British interests. Company officials could not be reached for comment.

Jonsmith turned over 578,000 shares, touched 88 cents and ended ahead three on the day. Montclair, with interest in Jonsmith, climbed 26 cents to 73 but eased later for a 15-cent gain on the day. Preston East Dome climbed 60 cents to \$6.50. Peruvian Oils climbed 45 cents, Pronto 35 and Casalar 15 to \$7.75. Also strong were Headway, Gunnar closing at \$12.25, Faraday, Coules, Croft, New Thurbol and United Asbestos which touched \$6.55.

Lorched dropped 26 cents to \$3.55 and Meta, Baska and Beaver Lodge were also easier.

Great Sweet Grass led western oils down with a 20-cent drop, but most index stocks gained narrowly. Most base metal changes were small and the group was mixed. Senior golds fell off in almost a solid line but juniors were strong.

Closing indexes: Golds up 41 at \$1.57, base metals off .36 at 161.38 and western oils up .35 at 103.61.
