enough to refuse to understand good old English, Yorkshire style. The row came about when West German and Dutch travelers hove into the berring shoals north of Whitty, Yorkshire and started to sweep up tons of herring in schools just four miles out. Lawrence Money, chief fishery officer for the area, said Friday he was flabbergasted when he saw the foreign boats talk to keep from being rained. Storr said the West German and Dutch travelers by saying they didn't understand English. "But when they picked up a radio message about good schools of herring, they are straight there," he said. "A lot of nets got fouled and a lot of tempers became frayed." Storr and Money both said the foreign fleets hovered just four miles out as the schools of herring raced into the area. The fishing limit is three miles. A spokesman for the Whitty trawlers were reaping a harvest all the West German and Dutch nudged in. "Those foreign boats are taking all the fish in this, a good year," he said. "Local men against such big boats and numbers." 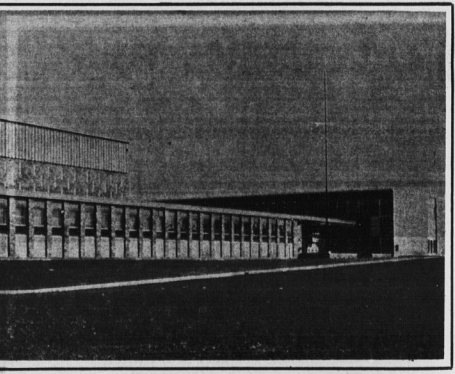
