DECEMBER MAGAZINES.

LIPPINCOTT'S.

The December "New Lippincott" breathes the Christmas spirit throughout. The complete novel by Ernest Reys in the December "New Lippincott" under the striking title of "The Whisking Mad," is a romance of rushing interest and weird beauty, surpassing anything yet achieved by a writer of far-reaching fame. It exhales the very breath of the Welsh land in which the scene is laid, and brings back the charm of love and martial glory which characterized the days of Celtic knighthood. Of almost equal importance with the longer novel is a brief one by William D. Howells, called "The Magic of a Voice," a bright and amusing tale of upper New York State, where the undercurrent of marvellous penetration is evident in an unusual degree, as well as Mr. Howells' keen sense of humor.

An actively subtle story "The Pursuit of the Red," by Flora Annie Steel, describes the visit of an Englishman and his sweetheart to a dastard of rascals, of India, where they seek the "secret" of the perfume. A Christmas paper on "The Star of Bethlehem," by Julia MacNair Wright, accompanied by a frontispiece from a beautiful painting of the "Star," by Henry R. Poor; "The return of William Penn," in December, 1699," by William Perrine, will be known as "Penn," Washington's death and the Doctors," by the authoritative pen of Solomon Solis Cohen, M. D., and a delightful talk about "Alphonso Dufay and his Intimate," written by one of the latter Jean-Francois Keffell, the celebrated artist now in this country, comprises a contents most interesting and reasonable. Elwin Markham, the author of "The Man with the Hoe," contributes a strong and impressive poem, significantly entitled "The End of the Century," "The Little Child," by Albert Bigelow Paine, and "Nazareth," by Thomas Walsh, are poems appropriate to the season.

CITY TAXES.—Look out for the defaulters' list of city tax payers, now ready for publication. This notice is final.

SOME SHIPMENTS.—During the season according to the Pioneer Mr. C. Kane, of Summerside has shipped from that port 175 cattle, 30 pigs and 5,050 sheep and lamb. The total value of which was \$18,390.

COMMITTED SUICIDE.—Mr. Alexander Fougere, of Campbellton, N. B. committed suicide a few days ago by hanging himself in a barn. He had been wrong in his head for several years.

MINSTREL SHOW.—The B. & A. Minstrel Company, which consists of 20 actors with a specially selected brass band will leave by the Jacques-Cartier on Friday morning for Victoria, where they will give a minstrel show, consisting of songs, jokes, vocal and instrumental music, etc., in Breen's hall, on Friday evening, December 15th. SOME PRODUCE.—There sailed from Crapaud last week the following schoers:—"Torato" 3,500 bushels of potatoes, 1,500 bushels of oats, 100 bushels of turnips and 4 tons of pork; "Vesant," 2,000 bushels of potatoes, 1,400 bushels of oats, 300 bushels of turnips, 1 ton of pork and 20 tons of hay; "Anne T. McKie," 1,500 bushels of oats, 100 bushels of potatoes, 200 bushels of turnips, 30 tons of hay; "Charming Lass," 5,000 (five thousand) bushels of oats. These four schooners were loaded by Wright, Bros., making eighteen cargoes this firm has shipped this fall.

AN IMPORTANT INVENTION.—An invention has been tested at Weymouth for steering any craft, whether submerged or otherwise, by means of an ether wave, on the wireless telegraph principle. The model was subjected to a variety of tests and followed the current wave as surely as if guided by a rudder. In addition to steering in straight lines, various figures were described. If further tests are successful, it is likely the system will be adopted by the Admiralty. Its effect on modern warfare would be inestimable, as it is asserted that the system cannot only be applied to torpedo and other craft but can be attached to mines and other destructive agencies, firing them without visible means at the most vulnerable spot.
