### 2 Players To Spark Borden

In spite of the fact that no one would bet doughnuts against diamonds that the Parkdale Royals would lose a game at Civic Stadium, attendance has been surprisingly good; as good, we should judge, as it was in former pre-Christmas seasons. Maybe the fans like to see the smooth play of Sandy's Dandies. It must be admitted that, although the Pope Motor Aces and Borden Legion Nationals have been soundly trounced at each outing, their second game in each case was an improvement over the first. Aces went from a 13-3 drubbing to an 8-3 score. Borden lost 8-9 in the first game and by only 11-5 in the second. If they keep improving they might make it a nip-and-tuck battle before the season is over.

DAVE MARTIN of the Aces and GABE KEOUGH of the Nationals are jet-propelled when their opponents are Aces and Nationals respectively, but against the Royals both boys find it harder to penetrate the blue-line. Keough scored one goal and played a fairly good game on Friday evening, but he wasn't the juggernaut he had been two evenings before against the Summerside aggregation.

STAN PEARDON fired four goals, GORD WHITLOCK and BIDDLES DOYLE getting a "hat trick" each. DAVE LAWLOR managed only three assists but the line of Whitlock, Peardon, and Dave Lawlor.

WALLY SHERREY was another boy who shone for Borden Friday night. Wally doesn't come in the jumbo size, but he makes up for lack of weight in aggressiveness and hustle. He figured in four of the five goals scored, getting a goal and three assists.

ers and five assists, for 15 points. Tied in runner-up spot, with Reardon is Alfie Flanagan, with six goals and seven assists, for the high-flying Charlottetown club. Dave Lawlor, also of Royals, has three goals and nine assists (tops in that category) for 12 points.

Gabe Keough of Borden's Legion squad and Angie Carroll of Charlottetown are tied with 10 points apiece. Keough shares the tie for most goals thus far with 8 and he has assisted on a pair, while Carroll has three goals and seven assists.

Dave Martin of Summerside and Daryl Doyle of Charlottetown share the next spot with nine points, while Borden's John Noonan and Elton Ellis each have eight points.

Aces' Willie Gallant (7), Dave MacPhee (6), and Bobby Perry (6) are next in the race, and there are four tied with four points apiece.

In goalie statistics, Donnie Frizzell of Royals has a 275 goals against average, including the only league shutout this season. He has 149 stops in 169 shots on him, for a 88 percent age. He is the only league goalie seeing action in all four games played.

Borden's Gary Campbell has been in three games and a period of the fourth, has an 8.10 goals against average, and an 825 percentage. Gordon MacLean in two periods was scored on six times and has a .667 percentage. Borden's overall percentage is 8.25.

Summerside's goalie record is an 888 percentage of stops over shots. Gerard Smith has seen all but one period of action this season. He has an 8.45 goals against average, compared to a team average of 8.45.

Gerald Smith of the Aces leads the penalty column with 43 minutes assessed to him in penalties. Close on his tail is Gerald Noonan of Royals with 40 minutes in the sin bin.

Charlottetown have 117 minutes in penalty-time while Summerside are next with 96 minutes, and Borden with 63. Charlottetown leads in goals scored (39), assists (49) and total points (88).
