

# British Columbia Runs String To Six Games

REGINA (CP) — British Columbia ran its unbeaten streak to six games Wednesday in the Canadian women's curling championships, shellacking Newfoundland 18-1 in only eight ends.

The two rinks quit without playing the final two ends. B.C.'s representatives, skippered by Ina Hansen of Kimberley, displayed overwhelming power in their lopsided win over Tinker Rockwell's rink.

The Hansen team, lead May Snow, second May Leith and third Ada Calles, drew to perfection, filling the house with rocks in all but the third end when Mrs. Rockwell had an easy draw for her only point.

Newfoundland now has a 2-4 record.
