

# Angustine Cove Man Dies After Accident

The body was resting at the Chisholm Funeral Home until Saturday morning when the funeral will be held at 9 a.m. to the Sacred Heart Church, Borden for Requiem High Mass. Entombment will be in Seven Mile Bay cemetery.

## Tighish Man Is Found Guilty Of Jorjring At Summerside

**SUMMERSIDE** — A resident of Tighish, Robert Joseph DesRosiers, was found guilty of a charge of jorjring and was remanded until this morning for trial. He had pleaded not guilty to the charge when arraigned yesterday before Magistrate W. D. MacDonnell, Middleton, testified that Sept. 16 he was in Summerside and parked his car near the Legion home. He did not lock the doors but took the keys with him. About 10:30 p.m. he returned and found it gone. He was reported missing to the town police on Sept. 17.  
Cpl. William Rowan, RCMP Summerside detachment testified that on Sept. 16, 1962, he was patrolling in the Summerside east area when he saw a white 1959 Ford speeding out toward a Read's Corner, Cst. Rowan gave chase and before approaching Read's Corner, he drove the police car into the path of the white Ford. He flashed the red light signalling the driver to stop. The driver, who was wearing a dark suit, was driving the car in his headlights because he turned around to look back. The car then took off at a faster rate of speed. Cst. Rowan followed the car until it turned m.p.h. towards Traveller's Rest.  
At Traveller's Rest, Cst. Rowan saw a white 1959 Ford with a dark suit man sitting on the seat. He later saw this man at the RCMP detachment the same evening.  
Cpl. Calvin Bugay, RCMP Summerside detachment, testified that on the same night he and Cpl. Bigelow patrolled in the Traveller's Rest corner in a police car. Cpl. Bigelow was wearing civilian clothes, and Cpl. Bugay had a uniform on.
