GRAIN

WINNIPEG, May 14 (CP)—Grain prices moved narrowly and generally displayed a lower trend in dull trade today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. The trend was influenced by declines on American markets and by the holiday in Europe. Oats and barley fell off under lack of aggressive commercial demand. Rye attracted some small American buying but selling also increased.

Export loadings involved about 1,000,000 bushels of Canadian wheat, with 350,000 bushels going to the United Kingdom; 350,000 to Japan; 85,000 to Belgium; 20,000 to Colombia; and a small lot to Switzerland. It also was reported that nearly 500,000 bushels of oats had been shipped from the lakehead to Chicago and a large quantity of maling barley to Milwaukee.

Class two wheat and I.W.A. prices advanced one-quarter cent from Saturday.
