BANGKOK (Reuters) — A "trade - not aid" theme dominated the opening session of the Colombo plan conference here. An expected clash of terms between the Malaysian Federation failed to materialize.

Speakers from several countries emphasized the importance of putting trade with developing nations on a solid, lasting basis, rather than allowing underdeveloped countries to depend indefinitely on aid from wealthy nations.
