## IN MEMORIAM

MR. ROBERT BREHAUT  
 The death occurred at the King's  
 County Memorial Hospital on May  
 7th, 1956 of Mr. Robert Brehaut  
 of Kinnross in his 68th year.

Death came quietly and as a  
 blessed release following several  
 years illness. There will always be  
 the remembrance of a loving Father  
 and husband who always upheld  
 Christian ideals, and who so patient-  
 ly bore his affliction as the shadow  
 of death hovered near. Because  
 of his loving manner, his  
 friendliness and goodness to every-  
 one and his kindness to friend and  
 stranger, Mr. Brehaut was very  
 highly esteemed by a wide circle of  
 friends and acquaintances.

For a number of years before his  
 health became broken, Mr. Brehaut  
 carried on a successful trucking  
 business. He was an active Liberal  
 Party worker, and was President  
 of the grand jury in North

 and near came to pay their last  
 respects to a friend and loved one.

 am," and "Abide with Me." A  
 solo, "Beautiful Isle of Somew-  
 here," was rendered by Lloyd  
 Martin.

 Brehaut, one Annie Richards of  
 Alberton, Mrs. Brehaut is sur-  
 vived by one son, Clinton, at home,  
 five daughters, Mary, Mrs. Char-

 P. E. I., and Kaye at home, also  
 two sisters, Sarah, Mrs. Harold

## New Assistant CNR Real Estate G. M. Named

MONCTON, N. B. (SPECIAL)—  
 Paul Blanchet has been appointed  
 to the general manager of real  
 estate Canadian National Rail-  
 ways, it was announced today by  
 P. Thomas, general manager. Les-  
 lie H. Collins, now assistant regional  
 manager of real estate, Toronto,  
 succeeds Mr. Blanchet as  
 regional manager at Moncton.

Mr. Blanchet was born in Quebec  
 on Oct. 19 1918, he joined the  
 CNR's motive power and equip-  
 ment department at Quebec in  
 1937. He held various positions in  
 the operating department until  
 Jan. 1st 1946, when he was ap-  
 pointed clerk in the real estate  
 department in Toronto. He was  
 subsequently named inspector of  
 real estate, Quebec, in March  
 1948, assistant regional man-  
 ager at Moncton in July 1951 and  
 regional manager in December  
 1954.

Mr. Collins was born in Mon-  
 treal on July 22 1903. He joined  
 the railway in 1921 as a junior  
 in the president's office, he later  
 served in the office of the vice-  
 president and general manager,  
 the pass, bureau, and the right  
 of way department until Septem-  
 ber 1940 when he became a clerk  
 in the land and townsites de-  
 partment. He was appointed spe-  
 cial representative of the real es-  
 tate department at Montreal in  
 October 1944, real estate inspector  
 in August 1948, chief real estate  
 inspector in Toronto in Dec 1954  
 and regional real estate manager  
 Toronto last December.

## Claims Liquor Laws Confuse, Annoy Tourists

"WINNIPEG (CP) — Conflicting  
 liquor legislation in Canada's 10  
 provinces confuses and aggravates  
 tourists who expect certain stand-  
 ards of service from hotels, W.  
 Ward Markle of Toronto, president  
 of the Hotel Association of Canada,  
 said Monday.

The association is holding its  
 28th annual meeting here, June  
 4-7.

Mr. Markle said in an interview  
 that hotelmen in some provinces  
 find it difficult to explain to tour-  
 lists why their hotels have no cock-  
 tail lounge and cannot offer them  
 the room service which is an  
 accepted part of hotel services in  
 most parts of the world.

In recent years the amount of  
 money spent by Canadians as  
 tourists abroad has been greater  
 by \$12,000,000 than the amount  
 spent by tourists coming into Can-  
 ada. Mr. Markle said he felt that  
 bad roads and inadequate liquor  
 laws are definite drawbacks to  
 Canada's tourist industry.
