Pittsburgh's 15th shutout was paced by Don Leppert with a homer and Don Hoak with a two-run double.

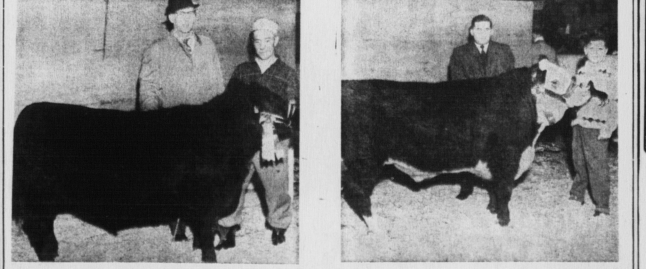
