

Habs Boston Play - Draw

By R. W. WHEATLEY MONTREAL (CP) - Boston Bruins, skating tirelessly and getting brilliant goal-tending by Bob Perreault, hung on to a 1-1 tie Thursday night with Montreal Canadiens in a fast and lively National Hockey League game.

Perreault went to Forbes Kennedy of the Bruins in the first period and Claude Provost of Montreal in the second. The point earned by Canadians lifted them into a third place tie with Toronto Maple Leafs in the NHL race. The Bruins remained in the cellar but their heads - up, sprightly play belied their lousy position. The smallest Montreal crowd of the season 12,866, saw a game in which speed was the feature and the Bruins dogged back-checking a close second. At that, Perreault was a busy man, pulling off 38 saves to 25 by Montreal's goalie, Bernie Goulet. Canadiens' big marksmen, Jean Beliveau and Guy Lafleur, were in the second period when they shot the puck into the net. IN CONFUSED STATE

Machen Is Detained At State Hospital

NAPA, Calif. (AP) - Mentally confused heavyweight boxer Eddie Machen slugged and reportedly knocked out two attendants at Napa State Hospital Wednesday night before he was overpowered and put under heavy sedation. "He is in a very confused state," Dr. W. C. Miller, hospital superintendent, said of the depressed fighter, who was confined to bed after a doctor for psychiatric examination after preparing to kill himself with a pistol. The 198-pound Machen was still sleeping under sedation in mid-afternoon Thursday and Dr. Miller indicated he would continue to rest. The ring veteran currently ranked by the World Boxing Association as No. 1 contender for Sonny Liston's championship, was detained at Napa state hospital after he prepared to shoot himself. He told officers he was broke, couldn't get fights and everything was "all wrong."

He boxed 10 full rounds to a draw with Cleveland Williams. Detroit Nips Rangers 4-3: Delvecchio Has 3 Assists

DETROIT (AP) - Detroit Red Wings scored three times in the last 15 minutes and half to beat New York Rangers for the last two periods in a 3-2 victory Thursday night.

The triumph moved the second-place Wings within two points of the Chicago Black Hawks, pacesetters in the National Hockey League. The Rangers scored both their goals 83 seconds apart late in the first period after Detroit opened a 2-0 lead. Parker MacDonald, of Sydney N.S., Gordie Howe and Floyd Smith sent the Wings into their early advantage with Alex Delvecchio assisting on all three goals. Harry Howell and Bronco Howard countered the Rangers before goalies Terry Sawchuk and Gump Worsley took over. Worsley made 38 saves in the Ranger net, nine more than Sawchuk. The defeat stretched New York's winless streak to six games.
