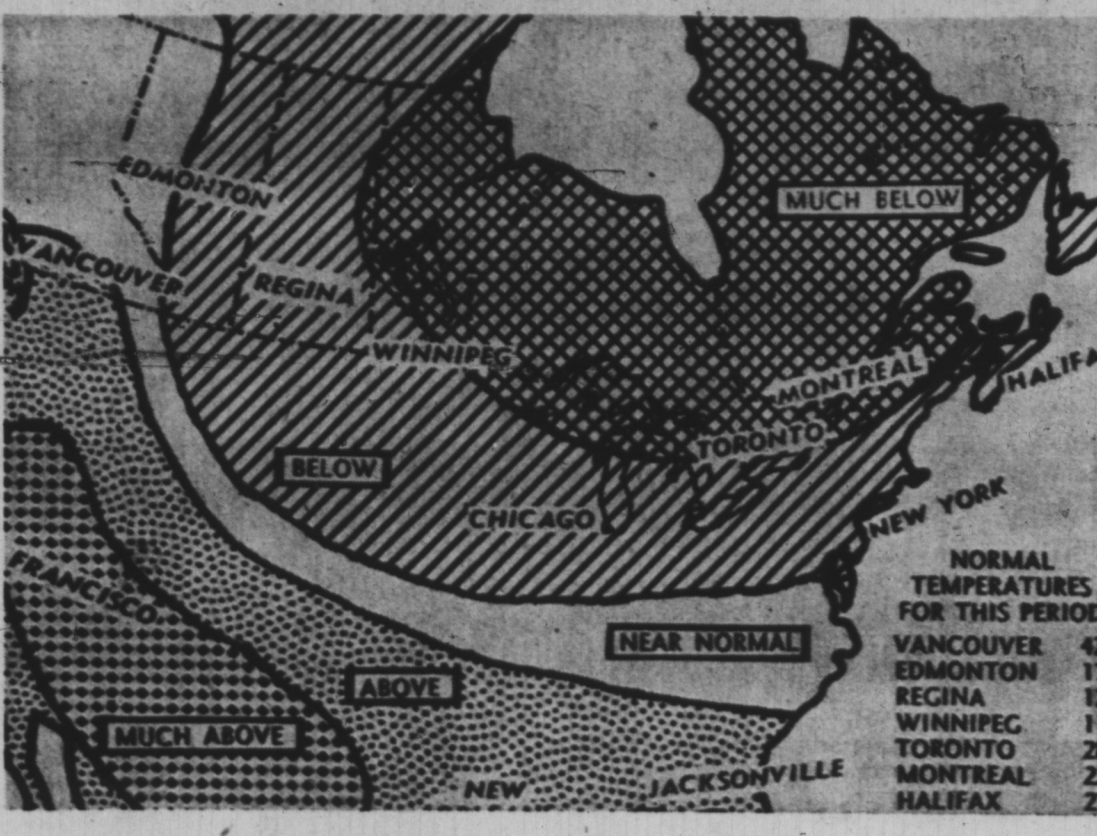

This map, prepared on the basis of the United States weather bureau's 30-day outlook, details the forecast for Canada and the United States. Prince Edward Island is close to the boundary of the much below and the below normal temperature band.



PRECIPITATION - This map shows the outlook for precipitation for the 30-day period, mid-February to mid-March. For the Prince Edward Island area the prospects is for moderate fall of either snow or rain. The Province is close to the edge of a second area in this case a light precipitation forecast.

Steel Production

In United States Shows Upward

CLEVELAND (AP) - The way the production of steel is increasing, the first week in March should set record for output, Steel magazine said today.

Last week mills increased operations 2.5 points to 86 per cent of capacity and turned out 2,440,000 net tons of steel for ingots and castings, the weekly journal of metal-working said. That total was only 85,000 tons under the production in the record week of Dec. 17, 1956.

If an operation of 90-per-cent capacity is maintained in the next four months, Steel said, the first half of 1959, output of mills will be 62,507,172 net tons and there was heavy strike-hedge buying at that time, too.

In January and February of 1956 saw mills operating at 90 per cent of a 128,363,000-ton capacity and producing 30,947,000 tons. Last month and this month mills have averaged about 87.6 per cent of an annual ingot capacity of 147,633,760 net tons and turned out 128,763,000 tons.
