Miss Beatrice Lanigan, Toronto is spending her vacation in Montague, guest of her mother Mrs. Hannah Lanigan.

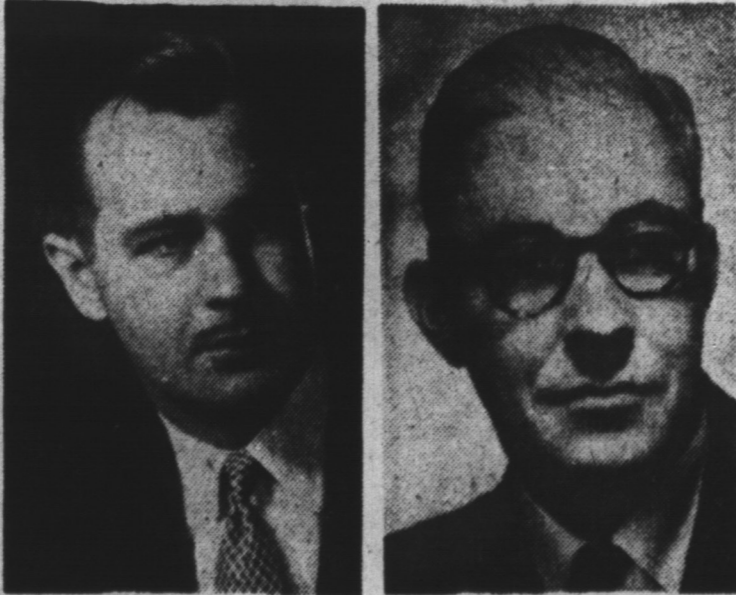

ATTENTION HOG PRODUCERS

Unless you have registered with the Canada Department of Agriculture and received a registration number you will not be eligible for any deficiency payment that may be forthcoming. The number and name exactly as registered must be furnished the trucker or driver at time of delivery of hogs. If this is not done it is probable that payment of premium, as well as eligibility for deficiency payments, may be held up as the grader is not supposed to sign the warrant for payment without the registered number of the producer.
