Professor Says U.S. Laws Are Intruding In Canada

MONTREAL (CP)—A McGill University professor says Canadian economic production is being affected by decisions of the United States Congress and that U.S. laws are shaped by U.S. financial interests.

W. H. Pugsley, speaking to the Montreal Association of Canadian-Italian Business and Professional Men, called Tuesday for a top-level Canada-U.S. conference to iron out all economic problems concerning the two countries, particularly the intrusion of U.S. laws in the Canadian economy.

Mr. Pugsley was a last-minute replacement for Eric Kierans, minister of health and former revenue minister, who was unable to attend.

Defending Mr. Kierans' recent letter to Washington, which concerned changes in American fiscal policy that affect Canadian subsidiaries of U.S. companies, Mr. Pugsley criticized those who emphasize lack of protocol in Mr. Kierans' communication.

He argued that Quebec has natural resources that need to be developed and the province should have the power to take development rights away from companies which do not do this, even if the company is prevented from going ahead by United States parent company restrictions on expenditure.

CITES N.B. ACTION

Mr. Pugsley cited the example of Premier Louis Robichaud of New Brunswick who had, he said, several years ago effected that transfer of development rights of a zinc deposit find near Bathurst, N.B., from one U.S.-owned company to another company. The reason was that the U.S.-owned company did not intend to exploit the find immediately.

He said that when most foreign countries invest capital in Canada they conduct their operations according to Canadian law. "But an American company in Canada can act according to U.S. laws as if Canada were the 51st state of the U.S.," he said.

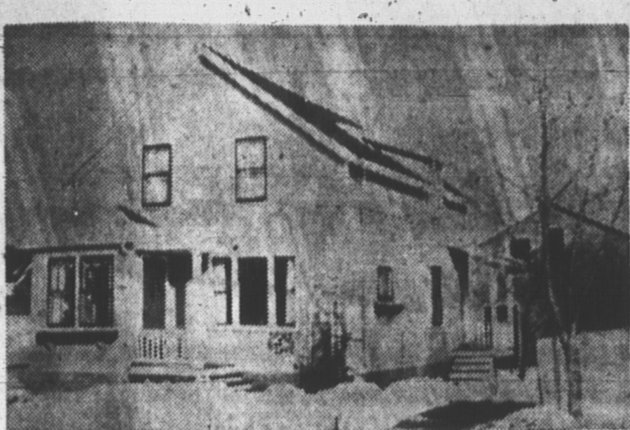

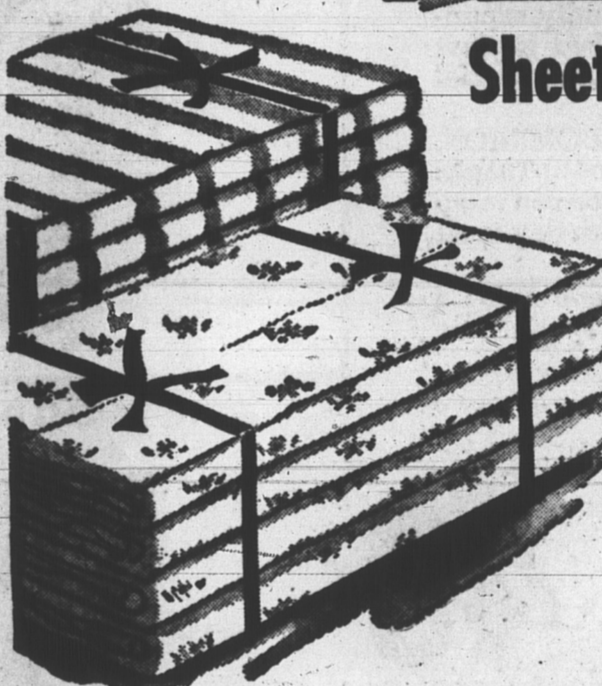

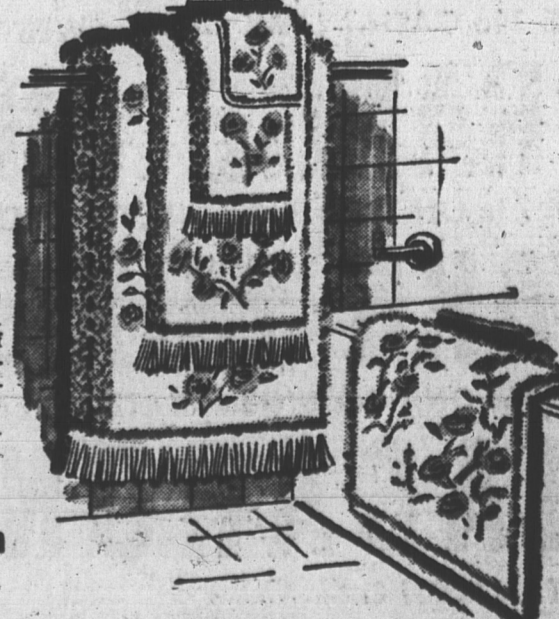
