Let's Talk It Over

To allow the Communist university students to enter Canadian universities, or not, seems to be a pretty live question. Of course, there are always considerations below the surface in controversies of this kind, and without knowing all the implications it is not possible to form a definite opinion. On the surface, however, the plan seems to have some advantages. It is rather surprising that the Russians should favor such a scheme. It seems almost a breach of the Iron Curtain policy to allow Canadian university students to get a look-see at conditions as they exist in Russia. On the other hand, Communist students coming into Canada, and seeing our social and political set-ups, could scarcely fail to be impressed with our more favored lot. They might go back as missionaries of democracy and spread the word among their fellows that democratic principles appear to contribute to a larger life than communistic principles do.

As regards the danger of allowing those communists into our midst, we think it may be somewhat exaggerated. According to the old adage: "The devil we know is better than the devil we don't know." So might it be with Communists. People in our country who pretend loyalty and devotion to Canada, but who are communists in their beliefs and purposes are more dangerous to us than are open and avowed Communists coming from Russia. Forewarned is forearmed.

In the last analysis, if nations with widely divergent ideologies are ever to understand each other, it must come from an interchange of ideas, a better knowledge of each other's beliefs and aspirations. This can be done only if Canadians, and others like them, become better acquainted with the Russian life, and Russians, (not the leaders but the common people of Russia), get a clear view of our way of life. Possibly this interchange of university students might turn out to be the first faint incision of a scalpel that would cut deeply into the cancer of international suspicion.
