Dominion Astronomer Retiring

OTTAWA (CP)—Dr. Carlyle S. Beals, who guided the Dominion Observatory through the period of its greatest expansion, retires Monday as Dominion astronomer. A recognized international authority in the science of astrophysics, Dr. Beals retires on his 65th birthday. He has been Dominion astronomer for 17 of his 37 years in the federal government service. Dr. Beals played a major role with other Canadian astronomers in what appears to be a successful attempt to restore this country to its former position of eminence in the field of astronomy. Due to his efforts and those of others the government is now considering construction of a powerful new optical telescope on a rocky mountain side in British Columbia or Alberta. The proposed telescope would have a reflecting mirror at least 150 inches in diameter, making it among the most powerful in the world.

A successor to Dr. Beals is expected to be named early next week.

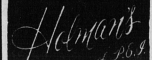
