

Queens Recount Set For Friday

A.W. Matheson, acting for Horace B. Willis, filed a petition for recount of the ballots cast in Second Queens in the recent provincial election yesterday. Judge C. St. Clair Trainor, Judge of Queens County court, set the recount for Friday, June 17, at 10 a.m. in the law courts building.

Following the election results showed Willis winning the seat for the Liberal Party by two votes with the totals being given as Willis 1,596 while Hon. Lloyd MacPhail, Conservative, had 1,594.

However, rumor were current for several days results were not correct for several polls with that in Rocky Point mentioned in particular. A check with the Returning Officer of the poll revealed a discrepancy which was confirmed when Determination Day result were announced.

TOTALS CORRECTED
At that time, following a check of ballot boxes by the Returning Officers of each county, it was stated the corrected totals stood at MacPhail 1,596; Willis 1,592.

At the same time there were strong rumors in the city today of the possibility of other recounts being asked, notably in the fourth districts of both Queens and Prince.

In the former Daniel Campbell, PC, lost by 25 votes to Liberal Stewart Ross with the totals announced on Determination Day of 1,901 and 1,925. In Prince County Fourth District Max Thompson, Liberal, was announced as winner over Ronald MacDonald with the totals given as 2,290 to 2,225.

Other accounts already announced are to be held in Kings County Fifth District where Liberal candidate for Assemblyman Arthur J. MacDonald has requested a recount after Determination Day placed the total at 689 for him and 690 for Dr. J.C. Sinnott, successful Conservative. In the voting for Councillor George J. Ferguson was listed as winner with 695 votes over Conservative candidate Harry McConnell with 688 and the latter has requested a recount.

mercial class at Souris Regional High School on Tuesday, June 14th the registration teams will go to Montague Regional High School to register the graduating students of the commercial class there.

Western Man Elected To Board

J.M. Logan, administrator of the Prince County Hospital, Summerside, was among the persons elected to the board of trustees of the Maritime Hospital-Service Association which held its annual meeting in Moncton recently.

M.A. Farmer, QC, Charlottetown was elected to the executive committee. Mr. Farmer was also named chairman of the legislation and by-laws committee. T. L. Doyle, a former resident of Charlottetown is the association's executive director.

Prince Edward Islanders attending the meeting were: Dr. J. A. McMillan, Dr. J. C. Sinnott and Dr. T. A. Laidlaw, Charlottetown and Mr. Logan from Summerside.

Mr. Doyle reported a net membership gain of 28,551 last year. Present membership stands at 390,225. During the year Plan income earmarked for members benefits soared to \$7,790,283, up \$698,798 over the previous year.

Annual Meeting At Georgetown

GEORGETOWN — The annual school meeting of Georgetown School District No. 1 was held in the School on Tuesday night with a small attendance. Seven ratepayers attended the meeting, which meant that only two ratepayers, in addition to the members of the Trustee Board and the Secretary, evidenced enough interest in the affairs of the school to attend the meeting.

Raymond Solomon was appointed chairman for the meeting and the minutes of the last annual meeting were read by the secretary, Mrs. Nelson W. Hansen and were moved adopted. Temple MacDonald, chairman of the Board of Trustees, presented the annual report of the trustees. He stated that nine teachers have been hired for the 1966-67 school year and that the tenth teacher will be hired in the immediate future. During the past year the board had engaged an auxiliary teacher and a remedial teacher and their work in the school had been entirely satisfactory.

The paving of the parking area and walks around the school has been completed. Four classrooms have been painted. A number of unforeseen expenses had to be met during the past term. One of those was the installing of a complete new furnace unit at a cost of \$3,000 and another was the settlement of a bill for architect's fees of \$1500, which had been in dispute since the building of the school. The meeting was informed that the school will have to have a new roof and estimates have been received to date from one contracting firm.





