MONTREAL (CP)—A depressed base metals group led the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges through their ninth straight session of declining prices. Trading was quiet Friday. The composite index dropped 0.55 to 157.34.

Utilities fell 0.66 to 153.78. Interprovincial Pipe Line dropped 1/4 point to a new low of 85. CPR was 1/4 at 77.00 and Bell Telephone 1/4 at 57.00.

Primary metals were also lower with Aluminum dropping 1/2 to 28 1/2 and Algoma to 60. Industrials dropped 0.57 to 163.37. Canada Cement fell one point to 45 and Moore Corp. 1/2 to 80 1/2.
