## Ancient And Modern Japan Is On Exhibition

Cultured pearls, silk, cameras, dolls, screens, watches and the latest in electronic equipment are some of the items that will be viewed today and Friday at the "Japan Today" exhibit held at the Charlottetown Hotel.

The exhibit, presented by the Japan Trade Centre in Toronto, has already been staged in Halifax, Saint John, N.B., St. John's, Nfld., and Moncton, N.B. It is set up under the direction of S. Azumura, S. Que, Y. Mori and R. Kikawa.

Two films will be shown continuously in one part of the exhibit. One is a documentary on the modern aspects of life in Japan. A short distance away from the "Himamatsuri" dolls, dressed in 17th century Japanese garb, is a transistor-powered television set with a five-inch screen. Weighing about eight pounds, it was put on the market within the last six months.

One display illustrates the painstaking process involved in creating "woodblock prints", while at another, the visitor can look through a newspaper with a circulation of 4,000,000 and find the Japanese characters for such phrases as "NATO", "Lester Pearson" and "What happened to Jane".

A tea ceremony set, a complete outfit of a lady's traditional costume, pieces of work silk and bamboo work are displayed. So are cameras, a marine radio by which ships can talk in directions and a tape recorder with a built-in radio, for taping program.

Visitors to the exhibit will have a chance to win five yards of fine Japanese silk. Everyone is given a card on which to state their name and their choice of pattern from the 20 displayed. Three lengths of the silk will be given at the end of the exhibit. The "Japan Today" exhibit begins at noon today, and remains open to the public until 9 p.m. On Friday it will again be open from 12 until 9.

## Request To Change Plea Refused By Magistrate

A request by defence counsel Allison M. Gillis, for permission to allow his client, Daniel Maurice Sheehan, Pt. DeRoche, to change his plea from guilty to not guilty, was denied by Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, in Queens County magistrate's court yesterday.

The magistrate said that due to circumstances surrounding the case, which charges an infraction of the Excise Act, the request could not be granted, and he remanded the accused until June 28.

Walter Berrigan, Charlottetown, appearing for sentence on a charge of break and enter was given a two-year suspended sentence and ordered to enter into a recognizance in the amount of \$1,000 with two sureties of \$500 each.

Charged with the same offense Edward Francis Burns, Charlottetown, changed his previous plea of not guilty to guilty and was remanded for sentencing until June 14.
