## Maple Leafs And Canucks Tie 1-1

TORONTO (CP) — Toronto Maple Leafs and Montreal Canadiens Wednesday night battled to a 1-1 National Hockey League tie before 14,046 fans.

The tie moved the second-place Montrealers to within two points of the idle Detroit Red Wings and assured Leafs of at least a one-point edge over New York Rangers in the battle for fourth and last playoff position.

Centre Don Marshall scored the Montreal goal with less than a minute to go in the first period and centre George Armstrong tied it with his 10th goal of the season early in the second.

For the first two periods, play was fast and both teams made fine end-to-end rushes. Close checking dominated the last 20 minutes as neither team would risk an all-out offensive drive for fear of the opposition getting a breakaway.

## Two Pre-Bonspiel Favorites Advance In Governor's Play

QUEBEC (CP)—Two pre-bonspiel favorites—Al Muth's Victoria rink and the Campbell brothers' team from Anoleis, Sask.—Wednesday won opening-round matches for the Lieutenant-Governor's Trophy in the Quebec 4th International Bonspiel.

Muth and Campbell now boast 5-0 win-loss records in the bonspiel with six games remaining.

Most of Wednesday's play was taken up in competition for minor awards—the Francois Jobin Gold Cup, the Holt Renfrew Trophy, the Val d'Or Trophy, the St. Lawrence Cement Trophy and the Dow Trophy.

Dr. J. C. Likely's Fredericton team entered the semi-finals for the Jobin Cup by edging R. Masse's Granby, Que., team 7-6.

The 124 teams from six provinces and several United States cities are competing for 15 trophies and awards. Final rounds in the week-long bonspiel will be played Friday and Saturday.

Half of the teams were drawn for competition for the Chateau Trophy and the other half for the Omega Trophy. Losers of first-round games in these events compete for the Francois Jobin Gold Cup.

CAMPBELL'S MUTH TANGLE  
Teams reaching the quarter-finals in the Chateau Omega and Jobin events are eligible to compete for the Lieutenant-Governor's Trophy. The rink winning most games in these four competitions is awarded the Grand Aggregate Bowl.

Those losing second-round games for the Chateau or Omega and those losing first-round matches for the Jobin Cup drop to lower competitions and vie for lesser awards.

The Campbells winners in 1955 of the Canadian curling championship and regarded as one of the finest curling units on the continent could face Muth's quartet in the Chateau finals. Both have reached the semi-final round to be played Thursday and if they win will tangle in Friday's finals.

The Muth rink last year won the Lieutenant-Governor's and Grand Aggregate Bowl. Another pre-bonspiel favorite Gaston Amyot's Quebec Jacques Cartier rink has entered the semi-finals for the Omega Trophy. It also is competing for the Lieutenant-Governor's but has not yet played its opening game in that event.

Today will see the first showdown with the Campbells and Muth rinks drawn in the next round of the Lieutenant-Governor's Trophy.

It is possible for a team to win three trophies—the Omega Chateau or Jobin—and the Lieutenant-Governor's and Grand Aggregate but no team has ever accomplished this. A perfect 11-0 record is considered almost necessary to win the triple crown.

The triumph at Madison Square Garden, gave Rangers 42 points—only one less than fourth-place Toronto, which tied Montreal 1-1 Wednesday night in Toronto. Third-place Bruins now trail the runner up Canadiens by five points.

The game was highlighted by a dazzling display of goal tending by the Rangers' Lorne Gump Worsley, who turned back 25 Boston shots.

New York went ahead 2-1 at 6:38 of the second period when Jack Evans drilled a 30 footer into the left corner of the cage. The Rangers boosted its margin to 3-1 midway in the third period on Dean Prentice's rebound of Andy Bathgate's shot.

The surging Bruins cut the deficit to 3-2 with less than two minutes remaining as Fleming Mackell found the range on a 50-foot blast from the left alley. Boston pulled rookie goalie Don Simmons in the final minute to gain an extra forward but the

Rangers staved them off.

New York went ahead early in the first period on Bathgate's 3-2 goal of the season, while Boston was short handed. With 96 seconds left in the period the Bruins tied it 1-1 on Cal Gardner's tally from point blank range.
