### C.N.R. Offers Special May Excursion Rate

MONTREAL, April 15—Special bargain fare excursions at approximately a cent a mile on tickets good going daily from May 14 to May 28 inclusive with a return limit of 45 days from day of purchase of ticket from territory including the Maritime Provinces, Quebec and Ontario to Western Canada, is the offer of the Canadian Pacific and Canadian National Railways as given by Mr. C. P. Riddell, chairman Canadian Passenger Association, here today.

The above fare is good in coaches only and where sleeping accommodations are required the following special bargain fares apply: (a) Tourist sleeping cars at approximately 1-4 cent per mile, plus regular berth rate; (b) Standard sleeping cars and parlor cars at approximately 1-2 cents per mile, plus regular berth or chair rate. Except as otherwise shown tickets will be good going via Port Arthur, Ontario, Armstrong, Ont., Chicago or Sault Ste. Marie, returning via the same route and line only. There are generous optional routings. Stop overs within the limit of the tickets are allowed at Port Arthur, Ontario, Armstrong, Ont., and West; also at Chicago, Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, and West, in accordance with the tariffs of United States railroads.

### Lady Rodney's Last Call at Halifax

HALIFAX, N.S., April 15—When the cruise liner "Lady Rodney" Canadian National Steamships, sailed from Halifax (Thursday) at midnight via Boston for Bermuda, the Bahamas Islands and Jamaica. She will bid adieu to this Atlantic port for the season, henceforth making Montreal her port of arrival and departure during St. Lawrence navigation. On the north-bound trip of her present voyage she is due to arrive Montreal May 10, and depart over the same route May 14.

The "Lady Rodney" will be preceded at Montreal by her sister ship the "Lady Somers" which is due there April 26th. With departure April 29 to initiate the season's cruise program from Montreal consisting of twelve 11-day cruises to Bermuda and fifteen 25-day cruises to Jamaica. The 2-day trip each way on the great St. Lawrence seaway combined with the ocean voyage provides each year a distinct lure to honeymoon couples and with our concession of ten per cent off the steamship fare during April and May, we anticipate that an unusual number of newlyweds will patronize our ships this spring," stated Victor E. Eke, passenger traffic manager of the company.

Among passengers of prominence on the present voyage will be G. McNair of Toronto Departmental, manager of the Imperial Oil Limited. Other passengers on this voyage will include Father Gillis, Father McNeill and Mrs. A. S. Michaels, all of Halifax. In addition to these passengers are many from New York City, Boston and Cambridge, Mass. The "Lady Rodney" will also carry a good cargo consisting of automobiles, lumber, shingles, hay, cheese, flour feeds, packing house products, drugs, dry goods, footwear, and many other manufactured commodities for the southern ports.

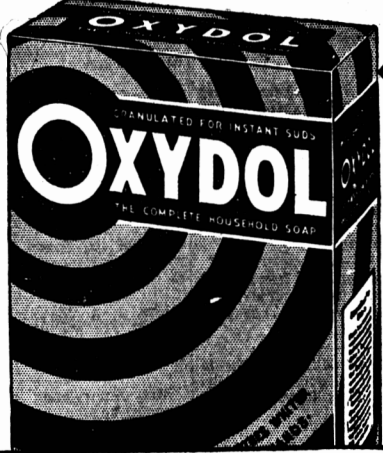

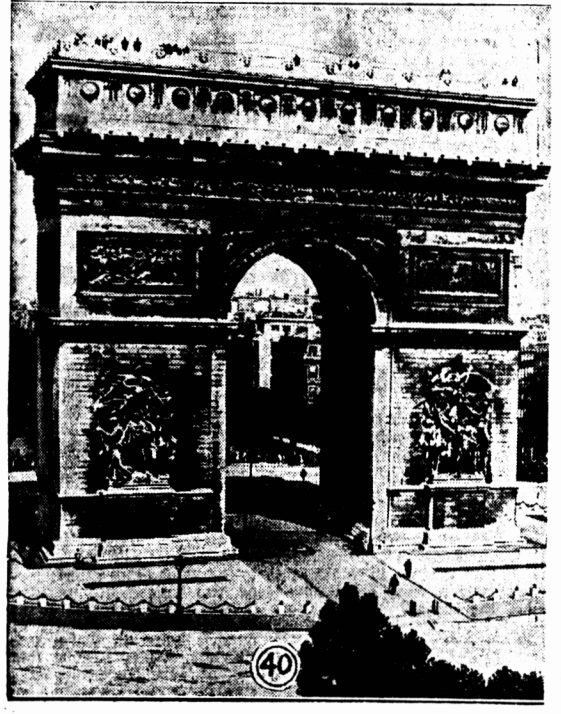
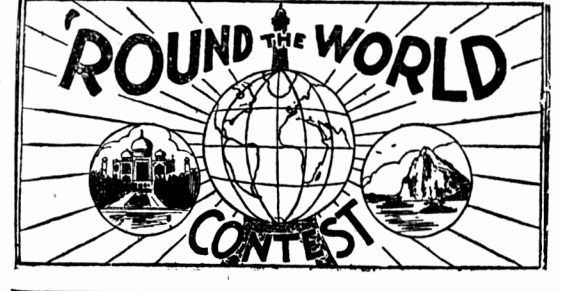
