

# 'Total Disarmament' Is Attacked By Lodge

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (CP) U.S. Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge Wednesday attacked the "all-or-nothing theory of disarmament" and urged instead a step-by-step approach guaranteed by inspection and control.

But Lodge, addressing the United Nations political and security committee, said the U.S. will give "the most careful scrutiny" to the total disarmament proposals placed before the UN general assembly Sept. 18 by Soviet Premier Khrushchev.

In this connection Lodge called for a UN study on what type of international police force would be needed to preserve peace and security if all nations left themselves naked of defensive arms.

**SEEK ANSWERS**  
The U.S. also sought detailed answers to the questions:

1. What principles of international law should govern the use of such a force.
2. What internal security forces, in precise terms, would be re-

## Coupon Publicity Causes Warning

CALGARY (CP) — Two Calgary newspapers say they have been warned against printing merchandising coupon advertising by a grocery chain until it has been approved by the Alberta department of industries and development.

The Herald and The Albertan say they received letters during the weekend from Deputy Minister J. E. Oberholtzer saying that a department study of advertising by Loblaw's Groceries (Alberta) Limited has shown it may be contrary to the provincial code of fair competition and business practice.

The papers quote Mr. Oberholtzer's letter as saying:

"Loblaw's head office has been advised in this regard and further that they are in danger of losing their retail trade license unless their advertising is modified to conform to the requirements of the regulations."

"Consequently we would request that your paper withhold any further advertising for that company until and unless the wording of the advertisement is approved by this office as being acceptable . . ."

## Missing Man Is In Trenton

TRENTON, Ont. (CP)—James Ross Farquharson, a CBC methods analyst who disappeared from Ottawa 14 months ago, has turned up at Trenton RCAF base and a spokesman said he was suffering from loss of memory.

He now is being held in the station hospital until his relatives are located.

Mr. Farquharson, 46, disappeared Aug. 15, 1956. Police found his car containing his clothing and identification papers on the banks of the Rideau River near Ottawa, but failed to find his body in a search of the river.

About a month after his disappearance, his 35-year-old wife, Helen, was found dead in her car at their home at Manotick, near Ottawa. Police attributed her death to suicide by exhaust fumes.

On Friday night Mr. Farquharson walked up to the guard at the gate of Trenton base and said he didn't know who he was, but thought he was Sgt. Ldr. Farquharson from a discharge card and pin in his possession.

An RCAF spokesman said he was well dressed but could remember nothing about his movements before approaching the camp.

He was identified through a photograph in a missing persons file held by Ontario provincial police at Belleville.

The authorities now are trying to locate one of Mr. Farquharson's relatives, who is believed to be away from home on a trip, said the spokesman.

In outlining U.S. policy in the committee's disarmament debate, Lodge declared:

"We are willing to take large steps or small steps—as long as they are real steps taken in confidence, and all concerned take equal steps together. The road to complete disarmament is long. The U.S. will be happy to travel to the end of it."

Mexican President Adolfo Lopez Mateos also spoke on disarmament in a visit to the UN, stating in a speech to the general assembly:

"Disarmament is a subject of such consequence that none would dare refuse to consider it, no matter in which aspect it may be stated, no matter in what way

### MENTIONS GAP

The president said the tremendous gap between the richer and the poorer countries is one of the "deeper causes" of war. He pleaded for international co-operation to improve the lot of the have-not countries.

Czechoslovakia's Jiri Nosek addressed the 22-nation political committee after Lodge and extended unqualified support—as was expected—for the Khrushchev plan which envisages a world without arms within four years. Vasily Kuznetsov, Soviet deputy foreign minister, elaborated on Khrushchev's statement last Friday.

Lodge put priority on a controlled cessation of nuclear weapons tests because "it is nearest to realization." He singled out three other aspects, none new, for consideration:

1. Reducing the threat of surprise attack.
2. Gaining experience in the actual operation of a workable system of control.
3. Lightening the weight of all armaments, both conventional and nuclear.

## Missing Man May Be Alive

MONTREAL (CP) — Madeleine Tremblay said Tuesday she has learned that her missing 34-year-old brother Robert may still be alive in the jungles of Ecuador, where he was reported slain by savage Indians last year.

Miss Tremblay said in an interview there have been "completely new developments" in the case. But she declined to elaborate, saying there has been "far too much unfounded speculation already."

She also said she received a telegram Tuesday from the external affairs department, concerning her brother. She did not disclose the contents of the telegram but said: "It did not say that Robert is dead."

Reports from Ecuador last year said Tremblay, a psychologist, was killed by members of the Auca tribe—headhunters he had set out to befriend for cultural study and conversion to Christianity.

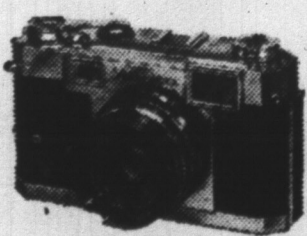
His family here has not heard from him since Feb. 10, 1958, when he left Quito on his third trip into the steaming jungle.

Miss Tremblay has made two trips to Ecuador to find out what happened to her brother, the last in February. She said she uncovered no evidence to confirm her brother was dead, but also none that proved he was alive.

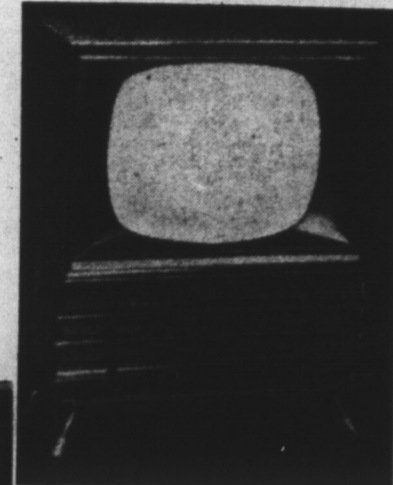
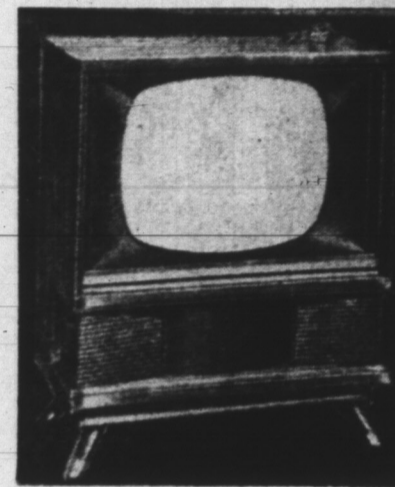

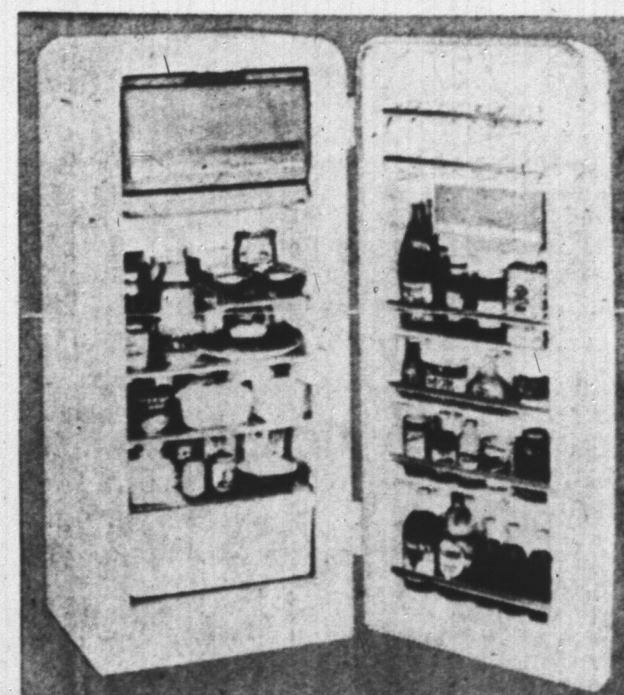
