

New Oil Finds In Alberta Aid Calgary Stock Market

CALGARY (CP)—Growing oil discoveries in northwestern Alberta are giving the 53-year-old Calgary Stock Exchange a new grip on the investor dollar and could help push the exchange this year to sixth position in share volume in North America.

This prospect was outlined a week ago when heavy volume forced the CSE to suspend trading for one hour and five minutes so floor traders could catch up with the action.

Canadian Centennial Roses Are Being Placed At Palace

LONDON (CP)—The Queen's head gardener, F. C. Nutbeam, will have an extra job Wednesday—planting 100 bushes of Canada's Centennial rose in the rose garden of Buckingham Palace.

A consignment of 500 bushes of the orange-coral floribunda rose, chosen to mark the 1967 centennial in a countrywide vote by 12,000 Canadians, is to arrive by air from Montreal Wednesday morning addressed to Buckingham Palace.

They are a gift from the Rotary Club of Montreal—Lake Shore and the Quebec Association for Retarded Children, sent to the Queen as a memento of Canada's 100th birthday and as a gesture of thanks for her \$25,000 gift to the association during her October, 1964, visit to Quebec City.

The Queen decided some time ago to plant 100 of the bushes in the palace rose garden, in the northeast corner of the wooded, 40-acre grounds. Some of the other plants will go to Sandringham, the royal family's country home in Norfolk where they spend most Christmas, and some to Balmoral Castle, their Scottish summer holiday retreat.

The Queen has given 100 bushes to the famous Wisley Gardens in Surrey, a showplace of prize blooms open to the public. The Canadian roses will be planted here in the memorial garden to Sir David Bowles-Lyon, the Queen's uncle on her mother's side.

Cuban Antiques Placed On Sale

TORONTO (CP)—Cuban antiques reported to have been confiscated from upper-class collections by the Castro government went on sale at a three-day auction at the Canadian National Exhibition grounds.

Jason Gardner of London, Ont., and Bruce Klein and William Phillips, both of Toronto, said they formed a syndicate to bring the art objects here after buying them in Havana from a government trading agency.

In the auction rooms, the antiques were taken from crates and boxes marked "Habana," but Mr. Gardner declined to say the goods had come from Cuba. He said the identity of the party for whom he is auctioning will remain confidential.

One item being sold is reported to be a framed 1940 letter from President Franklin D. Roosevelt to Hon. Francisco Gomez, then Cuba's secretary of communications.

Two diamonds as played by this North-South pair was a conventional bid showing four spades, five hearts and four cards in the minors. Two no-trump was also conventional, asking for clarification of the distribution of North's holdings in the minor suits. Three clubs guaranteed either three or four clubs.

Realizing that North had at most one diamond, and unwilling to be intimidated by the artificial bids being employed by his opponents, East elected to bid three diamonds.

South was firmly of the opinion that this contract could not be made, and he doubled. West showed his preference for diamonds by passing with his better singleton, and three diamonds doubled became the contract. The unfortunate 8-0 trump break was more than wound up going down five.
