### CUNARD STEAMERS TO BE CHARTERED

For Winter Atlantic Service.

Hon. Mr. Fisher Breaks a Pledge on Behalf of the Spoils System.

MONTREAL, Nov. 4.—The Beaver Line will charter two Cunard line ships for the Canadian Atlantic Mail Service.

Contrary to the definite pledge made by Hon. Mr. Fisher in the House of Commons last session, John Dyke, for many years the efficient representative of the Canadian Government at Liverpool, is to be turned adrift without any retiring allowance. Mr. Fisher kept Dyke in office until Mr. Fisher became initiated into the details of the office.

### HAMBERLAIN ON THE EMPIRE.

Improved Relations with South Africa.

Closer Union with the Colonies Predicted

GLASGOW, Nov. 4.—In the course of a speech here last night, Mr. Chamberlain declared that the relations between Great Britain and South Africa had greatly improved of late. He added that there are signs that the Colonies demand for closer union will yet be granted and the prospect of a really United Empire is becoming a question of practical politics.

## THE TAMMANY VICTORY.

Opinion of the British and Continental Press.

What Bryan Says About It.

LONDON, Nov. 3.—The papers here and on the Continent are unanimous in deploring the Tammany victory in New York.

LINCOLN, Neb., Nov. 3.—Mr. Bryan says that the New York election shows that Republican politics are not being endorsed at the polls. He says that the 16 to 1 standard is nearer now than it was a year ago.

### LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

LONDON, November 2.—According to the Madrid correspondent of the Standard, the Bank of Spain has agreed to advance the Cuban treasury 80,000,000 of pesetas, and the treasury of the Philippine Islands 30,000,000 on the guarantee of the Spanish treasury.

WINNIPEG, November 2.—The business of the Northwest land companies show enormous increase. The C. P. R.'s sales last month were double those of last year.

LONDON, November 2.—A meeting of the delegates of the Amalgamated Association of Cotton Operatives, the strongest body in the cotton trade, was held Sunday at Manchester, and confirmed the decision taken on Thursday last by the cotton operatives throughout the north of England, to inform the employers that the proposed reduction in wages would not be accepted. It was resolved that if the masters gave formal notice of reduction, the Association will take a ballot as to the course to be pursued by the operators.

### FRENCH AND GERMAN ARMIES.

A writer in one of the London newspapers has an interesting comparison of the French and German armies. In points of actual numbers of men, France has rather the advantage. The peace establishment of cavalry is 77,000 in France, against 67,000 in Germany. France, too, in peace has 48 more guns, but the war total is largest in Germany by 414. Again, France maintains more horses in peace, but in war the Germans approximate very closely, in the first line alone having 328,000 against 340,000 French; while there are 200,000 more in the second German line. The grand total of the German personnel is just two millions and a half, field and second line together, and behind is the Landsturm, some three millions more, of which half a million have been regularly trained. The chief work carried on of late in the German army has been the reorganization of regiments. Till April 1 this year it consisted of 538 battalions and 173 half battalions, and now there are 624 whole battalions, and each of these has been given a revised strength of officers and rank and file. No definite decision has been arrived at as yet as to the re-arming of the field artillery. The chief new services to be provided under the increased budget, £27,338,900 for 1897-8, as against £27,190,545 for 1896-7, are field railway material, said to be for fortress warfare, money to create a military telegraph school and adopt a field telegraph system; the establishment of travelling field-ovens for the bakery columns, and a second instalment for the purchase of reserves of provisions.

### THE NEWS IN SHORT METRE.

Items of Interest Botted Down For More Easy Reading.

The guarantee fund of the Glasgow exhibition in 1901 now amounts to £130,000.

A new torpedo destroyer is to be built at Newcastle-on-Tyne, with turbine engines, which is expected to attain a speed of thirty-six to forty knots an hour.

Dr. J. C. Spencer, bacteriologist of the board of health, of San Francisco, reports that he has discovered the bacilli of tuberculosis in a Chinese-made cigar which he examined.

Willard, the 13 year old son of J. H. Hanington, who lives about eight miles from Mooseton, was badly gored in the groin on Sunday evening by a vicious bull that had strayed to his father's premises.

United States Ambassador Hay, on Saturday, telegraphed to the Queen at Balmoral an expression of President McKinley's sympathy and condolence upon the death of the Duchess of Teck.

A Boston despatch states that for the second time in two years that city, ordinarily strongly Democratic, has given a substantial majority to Roger Wolcott, the republican candidate for governor at the state election.

The situation in Western Africa has been greatly aggravated by the publication of semi-official notes by the French and British governments, and a conflict between the forces of the two nations in the hinterland of Lago may at any moment take place.

England will soon have the longest tunnel in Europe. The London and North-Western Railway Company have decided to bore through the steep incline, familiar to all travellers to Scotland as Shapfell. The tunnel will be ten miles long, or half a mile longer than St. Gothard's.

An Indiana professor who took out a \$3,500 insurance policy in 1850 received an offer from the company twenty years ago to cash the policy for \$2,000 or pay him an annuity of \$410. He elected to take the annuity, and now, at the age of 90 years, has drawn from the company more than \$8,000.

Last Tuesday while 65 workmen were on a large scaffolding extending the whole length of the Wabash building at St. Louis, which was recently partially destroyed by fire, a section of the platform gave way, carrying eight men to the floor below. Two were fatally injured and four others seriously hurt.

The Paris police have just arrested a band of burglars, who are believed to have been the perpetrators of numerous recent robberies. One of the gang is a member of the noble family of Cazcau de Derlieu. The youth, who is now only 18, was left an orphan at a very early age, and has had a most adventurous career.

The fossil remains of a large extinct mammal were found five hundred feet below the surface in a coal mine near Kymi, in the western part of the island of Euboea, believed to belong to the miocene age. It is larger than the rhinoceros. Athens experts say the species is undeterminable.

Despatches from Madrid say that the recent magazine articles of Hannis Tavor, the former minister of the United States at Madrid, on Cuban affairs, has produced an unpleasant feeling at the Spanish capital and it is added that the belief prevails there that the government will be compelled to intervene in this affair.

The long deferred trial of the directors of the defunct banks was begun at St. John's, Nfld., on Tuesday before Sir David Patrick Chalmers, former chief justice of British Guiana, who came from England to conduct the proceedings, as the local judges were ineligible because they were more or less interested in the defunct banks.

An Irishman, named Patrick Galvin, who has just arrived at Juneau from Dawson City, seems to have abundantly enriched himself by his labors in the Gold fields. He says that he went to the Yukon three years ago in a penniless condition, without any great expectations and he is now returning to Cork, his native City, a rich man. Before leaving Dawson City he disposed of one of his claims for \$100,000. He displays a nugget the size of an oyster as one of the trophies of his industry.

Hon. George E. Foster's apt expression, "splendid isolation," still applies to Old England. Russia is stirring the Indian border tribes against her, and France, with whom Russia is in alliance, has joined the Mahdi to oppose her in the Sudan, and has assailed her position on the east coast of Africa. The outlook is cloudy to day, as the Mail and Empire remark. But the splendid statesmanship of the Imperial leaders, and the splendid courage of British forces, will dispel the difficulties and lend added glory to the Empire.
