YOUNG DANISH WOMAN STRANGLER TO DEATH IN NEW YORK CITY

Her Mutilated and Decomposed Remains Found in an Apartment in Harlem.—Arrested on Suspicion.

NEW YORK, October 3.—The body of Jennie Larsen, a young Danish woman, 20 years old, was found in the apartments of Louis Appleford, on the third floor of a tenement in Harlem to-day. She had been dead for days, according to a medical expert; the body was mutilated and much decomposed. Despite the gas and stench which revealed the tragedy, Appleford, in a dazed mental condition

was in the room when it was entered by the police. Coroner Scholer is of opinion that the girl was strangled to death. Appleford when questioned by the police would say little except that he had turned on the gas in the room for the purpose of committing suicide. The police do not accuse Appleford of murdering the young woman, but think that he knows more about the case than he is willing to tell.

BALDWIN TELLS OF QUARRELLING ON THE NORTH POLE EXPEDITION

"Never Take a Swede and a Norwegian Together With You", is His Advice—Thinks Knowledge Gained of Air and Ocean Currents and Meteorological Observations Made Will Be Valuable to Science.

NEW YORK, Oct. 2.—Evelyn B. Baldwin, the Arctic Explorer, arrived today on the steamship Germanic. Mr. Baldwin made the following statement:—"There is not a word of truth in the report of our not having sufficient supplies. It is easy to explain the trouble between myself and Captain Johannsen. He wanted to be the whole thing. That's all. The trouble first started between the sailing master and the ice pilot, whose name is Arnsen. The ice pilot took up his place

in the crew's nest on the ship when we were in the ice fields and should have had, and eventually did have complete charge of the direction of the ship. The sailing master objected to the pilot holding absolute sway over the movements of the ship at any time, and that is how the row began. I, of course, took the side of the pilot, and saw that he was kept in command while we were in the ice. This pilot had had 20 years experience in the ice fields, while the sailing master had practically none.
